WHAT'S ON TAP: A full slate of games is scheduled showcasing high school and collegiate women's hockey.

The Fighting Sioux are scheduled to play WCHA rival and defending NCAA champion Wisconsin at the UP Center at 7:37 p.m. both nights.

Along with the WCHA series, Concordia College is scheduled to play Concordia (Wis.) in NCAA Division III action, along with two North Dakota High School girls' hockey games between Fargo South and Devils Lake on Friday and Fargo North and Bismarck on Saturday.

MEDIA INFORMATION: Most Fighting Sioux regular season home hockey games can be heard on 1440 AM ("The Fan") and on stations across the Fighting Sioux Radio Network (excluding Dec. 13 against Minnesota) with broadcaster Darrin Looker calling the action. Dan Hammer will be calling the action in Fargo, N.D., against Wisconsin. A webcast and live stats will be available at FightingSioux.com

SCOUTING REPORT: The Badgers are currently in third place in the league with 19 points from nine wins and one tie ... Wisconsin is 12-5-3 overall this season ... In conference play, the Badgers are averaging 2.93 goals while giving up 1.79 ... Sophomore Brooke Ammerman leads the team in goals (14), assists (nine) and points (23) ... She is followed by junior Mallory Deluce (9-7-16) and freshman Brianna Decker (6-7-13) ... Becca Ruegsegger and Alanna McCready have split time in net for a combined .922 save percentage and a 1.82 goals-allowed average ... They have gone 11-for-93 (.118) on the power play and have converted 90-of-101 (.891) penalty-kill opportunities.

COACHING STAFF: They are led by interim head coach Tracey DeKeyser, who is filling in while Mark Johnson takes a sabbatical to coach the U.S. Olympic Team.

THE ALL-TIME SERIES: The Badgers lead the all-time series 25-1-0 with its only loss coming this season.

On the night Wisconsin hung its nation championship banner, the Sioux got to play the role of spoiler. Freshman Ashley Furia scored the eventual game-winner late in the first period, senior Alex Williams added a goal and redshirt freshman Jorid Dagfinrud made 29 saves for the shutout win in her first collegiate start.

LAST ACTION: The Sioux opened their second-half action on New Year's Day with a two game series against Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference's Union College.

Despite outshooting the Dutchwomen 35-20, the Sioux were edged 3-1 for a disappointing

start to the new decade. Ashley Furia scored the lone goal, her fifth of the season. Still stymied through the first period and much of the second period offensively, the Sioux erupted for five goals in the final 25 minutes the next day.

Freshman Mary Loken led the way with two goals and 11 shots, while junior Stephanie Roy and sophomores Sara Dagenais and Margot Miller added one goal each.

Jorid Dagfinrud collected her second win of the season, both by shutout, making 14 saves.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: North Dakota's Mary Loken, a freshman forward from Roseau, Minn., scored two goals, fired 11 shots on goal and was a +2 in the Fighting Sioux's 5-0 shutout road victory against Union College last Sunday.

After a scoreless first period of play, Loken got North Dakota on the board first, scoring what proved to be the eventual game-winning goal at 15:03 of period two. She later added the first goal of the third period, scoring at the 3:02 mark, as UND built a 3-0 advantage enroute to the 5-0 win.

As a rookie, Loken has played in all of UND's 18 games so far this 2009-10 season and ranks second in scoring among her teammates with 12 points on six goals and six assists. She has two power-play goals, one game-winner and one game-tying tally to her credit.

THE SPARK THAT SET A NEW MARK: Looking for a spark head coach Brian Idalski made a goalie change for the third period in its second game against Maine, as senior Brittany Kirkham entered the game trailing 3-0. The Black Bears were held off the scoreboard which allowed the Sioux to come back and tie the game. In doing so, Kirkham played in her 87th career game breaking the record of games played by a Sioux goaltender previously held by Amber Hasbargen (2002-06).

POLL POSITION: The Sioux are currently not ranked or receiving votes.

WONDERFUL TONIGHT: Alyssa Wiebe set a new program record as she scored five points against the Huskies in their overtime winner. She notched two goals and three assists picking up a point on every Sioux goal in the game.

Wiebe, along with Meagan Gilbert and Mary Loken, all had three assists in the game which ties the record for assists in a game that had only happened nine times before.

PERFECT START: Redshirt freshman Jorid Dagfinrud's regular-season opener shutout against defending national champion and then top-ranked Wisconsin was the first time a Sioux goaltender has opened their collegiate career with a shutout. It is also the first time in the programs history that the Sioux have won by shutout in its opening game.

CONFERENCE VS. COUNTRY: Junior Kelly Lewis and sophomore Alyssa Wiebe were chosen to WCHA All-Star Team that faced the U.S. Women's National Team including UND's Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn. The U.S. National Team defeated the WCHA All-Stars 6-1 with M. Lamoureux scoring a goal and an assist in the game. The Sioux faced off against the U.S. Olympic team Oct. 10 in Warroad, Minn.

MY GOAL IS TO DENY YOURS: Kirkham tied Margaret-Ann Hinkley's (2003-04) school record of six career shutouts against Union Oct. 24, 2009. Her next shutout will give her sole possession of the record. Kirkham had four shutouts in her sophomore season which tied the season record of Hinkley's.

YOUNG BLOOD: There are a lot of new faces on the 2009-10 Sioux bench, a year after rewriting the record books and finishing tied for fifth place in the WCHA standings, its highest finish ever. UND will have 10 freshman and one redshirt freshmen looking to add depth to the Sioux lineup. This group replaces the loss of four graduating Sioux (Melissa Jaques, Randi Motsko, Casie Hanson and Kelsey Fletcher).

BRANCHING OUT: Head coach Brian Idalski has been adamant about stating that he and his staff will recruit kids locally but also from where ever the top players are at. This year's team is starting to show evidence to that with a roster made up of players from four different countries (United States, 15; Canada, 8; Germany, 1; and Norway, 1), five different states (Alaska, 2; Colorado, 2; Michigan, 1; Minnesota, 7; and North Dakota, 4) and six different provinces (Alberta, 2; British Columbia, 1; Manitoba, 1; New Brunswick, 1; Ontario, 1; Quebec, 1; and Saskatchewan, 2).

A NEW LOOK, BUT THE SAME TEAM: The Sioux will be sporting new jerseys this season for the first time in program history.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: Senior D Kelly Lewis (Forest Lake, Minn.) will serve as captain of the 2009-10 Fighting Sioux. Seniors D Cassandra Flanagan (Great Falls, Manitoba) and G Brittany Kirkham (Ottawa, Ontario) were named assistant captains.

RAISING THE BAR: The expectations for the Sioux continue to rise under head coach Brian Idalski and his staff as every year his teams have improved in the standings. Taking over a team that went winless in the WCHA (8th place) prior to his first year when the Sioux won four games (7th place) and last year nine games (t-5th place).

THE PURSUIT OF GOLD: UND's newest additions to the team and Grand Forks natives Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux will be redshirting this season as the sophomores are part of the 21-player roster for the 2009-10 U.S. Women's Olympic Team.

The twins are centralized in the Twin cities and taking part in the Qwest Tour, a 10-game, nine-city domestic tour that began on Sept. 25 in St. Paul, Minn., and concludes just prior to the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, British Columbia. The twins and the team faced the Sioux in exhibition action in Warroad, Minn., on Saturday, Oct. 10.

Jocelyne and Monique are the first-ever women's Olympians while active student-athletes at UND. Senior Susanne Fellner played in the 2006 Olympics for the German National Team before becoming a Sioux.

Brian Idalski is entering his third season as the head women's hockey coach at North Dakota.

Idalski led UND to its highest finish since the program joined the WCHA, tying for fifth place. The Sioux went 9-16-3 in league play and 13-19-4 overall.

UND broke numerous team and individual records and raised its national rank in attendance from 10th to seventh at home games. The Sioux were ranked in the USCHO.com/CSTV Division I women's hockey top-10 poll for the first time

and swept three conference opponents after having only done so once previously in the history of the program.

In his first season behind the Sioux bench, Idalski guided a youthful team to a four-win WCHA improvement from the previous season. Along the way, UND also increased its offensive output by half a goal per game while lowering its goals against by nearly the same margin from 2007-08. All were promising signs that better days were ahead for a program that is essentially still in its relative infancy.

Idalski was hired as head women's hockey coach at the University of North Dakota on April 11, 2007 and was officially introduced at an April 12 press conference at Ralph Engelstad Arena.

Said Idalski at the time of his hiring at UND: "I am looking forward to its challenges and I am excited for the opportunity to create a culture of winning and a tradition of excellence with the UND women's hockey program."

Prior to coming to UND, Idalski spent the 2006-07 season as an assistant coach with St. Cloud State University's women's hockey program, where his primary responsibilities included coaching the defensemen, scouting opponents and overseeing all aspects of recruiting.

Before that, Idalski enjoyed a highly successful five-year tenure as head women's hockey coach at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, where he amassed a 108-21-11 (.811) record and was a four-time finalist as American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) National Coach of the Year.

Idalski guided UW-Stevens Point to an NCAA Division III runner-up finish in 2003-04, a third-place national finish in 2005-06 and a national quarterfinal finish in 2004-05. He led the Pointers to three Northern Collegiate Hockey Association (NCHA) regular season championships (2002, 2005, 2006) and four NCHA playoff titles (2002, 2004, 2005, 2006) and was twice named NCHA Coach of the Year (2002, 2005).

Said Idalski: "I am looking forward to its challenges and I am excited for the opportunity to create a culture of winning and a tradition of excellence with the UND women's hockey program."

During his time at UW-Stevens Point, Idalski tutored three All-Americans, six Academic All-Americans and 17 All-NCHA selections.

In 2005-06, his final year at UW-Stevens Point, the Pointers went 21-5-4 overall and 11-1-3 during league play and advanced to the Division III Frozen Four for the second time in three years, where they finished third.

During 2004-05, the Pointers posted a 22-3-1 record and became the first team to finish the NCHA regular season undefeated as Idalski was named the league's coach of the year for the second time in his career.

In 2003-04, just his third year at the helm, the Pointers finished 19-7-2 and played one of the nation's strongest schedules, taking on six of the top eight teams in the country. Currently, UW-Stevens Point is still the only West Region team to reach the Division III NCAA National Title game, falling 2-1 to host Middlebury (Vt.).

Being named the NCHA Coach of the Year after his first year as head coach with the Pointers, Idalski also earned NCHA regular season and playoff titles after finishing 20-5-2 in 2002-03 and 26-1 in 2001-02.

A four-year letterwinner at UW-Stevens Point from 1991-1995, Idalski was a member of the Pointers' NCAA Division III runner-up team in 1992 and was a sophomore on the 1993 Division III national championship team. In 97 career games as a defenseman, he tallied five goals and 20 assists.

Following his Pointer playing days, Idalski went on to play professional hockey for two years with the Madison Monsters of the United Hockey League from 1995-1997. He then played two seasons with the Columbus (Ga.) Cottonmouths of the Central Hockey League from 1997-1999, and won the 1998 CHL regular season and playoff championship. After his professional playing days, Idalski spent the 1999-2000 season as the full-time assistant coach with the Cottonmouths.

Idalski has also been involved for several years as an instructor at the USA Hockey National Development Camps and other instructional hockey camps throughout North America.

A Warren, Mich., native, Idalski his wife, Nicole, have four sons, Beau, Jason, David and Mitchel.
