IN THE PAINT

- Head coach **Brian Jones** enters his 11th season at the helm of North Dakota men's basketball program and has led UND to five ColleagueInsider.com Postseason Tournament appearances in the past six seasons.
- The 2016-17 season will mark the fifth for the club in the Big Sky Conference. UND is 40-40 in its first four seasons in the league and advanced to the Big Sky Tournament title game in 2014 and the semifinals in 2013 and 2016.
- Jones will have all five starters back and seven of his top eight scorers from a 17-win team a season ago. The Fighting Hawks pushed eventual Big Sky champion Weber State to overtime in the tournament semifinals, then hosted a CIT game for the first in program history. Top-seeded UC Irvine traveled to Grand Forks for the opening round game and also needed overtime to outlast the home team. The Anteaters would go on to finish runner-up in the 26-team tournament.
- Senior **Quinton Hooker** returns to the backcourt after racking up All-Big Sky first team honors and being named to the College Sports Report Mid-Major Player of the Year via fan vote.
- Hooker was third in the league in scoring at 20.1 ppg and earned Big Sky All-Tournament honors after averaging 27.0 ppg in three games in Reno.
- He reached double figures in 30 of 32 games, including four games of 30 points or more. Hooker set UND's DI single-game scoring mark with 38 points in a win vs. Portland State and matched that total in the semifinal loss to Weber State.
- Hooker's not only adept at scoring as he also ranked second on the team in assists (112/3.5 apg), rebounds (156/4.9 rpg) and steals (60/1.9 spg).
- Junior **Drick Bernstine** was the only Fighting Hawk to start all 33 games a season ago. The Denver transfer was third on the team in scoring at 9.7 ppg and led the team and ranked third in the Big Sky in rebounding at 9.1 rpg. His 299 total rebounds were a UND Division I single-season record.
- Bernstine recorded his ninth double-double in the quarterfinal win over Idaho State in Reno, setting the Big Sky Tournament single-game record with 21 boards.
- Sophomore **Geno Crandall** earned 27 starts at point guard in his rookie season and ranked sixth in the Big Sky in assists (129/4.2 apg). He also chipped in with 10.8 ppg (second on the team) and went 6-for-6 from beyond the arc in his collegiate debut at Wisconsin.
- Sophomore **Carson Shanks** is back after starting 24 games and appearing in 31 during his first full-season as a Fighting Hawk. He averaged 5.5 ppg and 3.3 rpg and had a career-high 16 points in the win at Idaho State (Jan. 9). Shanks also had an 11-point, season-high nine rebound effort in the Big Sky Semifinals vs. Weber State.
- Rounding out the five returning starters is guard **Corey Baldwin**, who averaged 7.8 ppg in his first Division I season. He reached double figures 13 times and had 20-plus point performances in road wins at Bradley (20) and Idaho State (22).
- Sophomores **Conner Avants** (6.8 ppg; 3.2 rpg) and **Cortez Seales** (7.5 ppg; 2.1 rpg) provided a scoring punch off the bench last season. Both players had 10 double-digit scoring games as true freshmen. Classmate **Josh Collins** saw spot duty a season ago and had a season-high seven points vs. Minnesota-Morris and chipped in with six points in 20 minutes of action at Kansas State.
- Walk-on **Thomas Blake** returns for his fifth season with the team. After redshirting during the 2012-13 season, Blake has appeared in 18 total games during his UND career.
- Jones will have five newcomers to potentially mix into his rotation this season, while Creighton transfer **Marlon Stewart** will have to sit out due to NCAA transfer rules. Stewart and Seales were high school teammates together at North Scott, leading the Lancers to their first state title in 2015.
- Those eligible to play right away include JUCO transfer **Jafar Kinsey** (Des Moines Area C.C.) and **Solomon Rolls-Tyson** (Utah State Eastern College). Kinsey is a 6-foot-2 guard that started his collegiate career at Robert Morris before averaging 17.2 ppg and 5.5 rpg at the JUCO level last season. Rolls-Tyson, a Birmingham, England native, averaged 6.5 ppg and 4.6 rpg as a sophomore forward for the Cougars. He'll provide front court depth for the Fighting Hawks with his 6-foot-8 frame.
- Jones also has a pair of true freshmen on his roster that will be vying for playing time this season. **Billy Brown** will provide back-court depth after earning Iowa Newspaper Association all-state second team honors as a senior (21.7 ppg, fourth in Iowa Class 3A). **Kienan Walter** is another 6-foot-8 newcomer that can stretch the floor with his shooting ability. He earned Washington Class 1A all-state honors as a junior and senior. Walter led all Class 1A in scoring as a junior (23.6 ppg) and added 22.0 ppg as a senior en route to Trico League MVP honors.

UND BY THE NUMBERS

- 1** Quinton Hooker recorded the first known triple-double in UND men's basketball history with 13 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists in a home win over Idaho State last season.
- 5** UND head coach Brian Jones has all five starters back from last season. That quintet had a combined 145 out of 165 possible starts in 2015-16.
- 7** UND will play seven opponents this season that advanced to postseason play in 2015-16, including three NCAA Tournament teams.
- 9.1** Drick Bernstine set UND's single-season Division I record for rebounding, averaging 9.1 per game and corraling 299 total on the season. He set UND's DI single-game high and a Big Sky Tournament single-game record with 21 in the quarterfinal win over Idaho State in Reno.
- 13** UND has 13 home games on the 2015-16 slate and owns a 110-53 record at the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center since its opening in 2004-05.

GRAND FORKS, N.D. – University of North Dakota head coach Brian Jones released his team's 2016-17 schedule in early September as he prepares for his 11th season at the helm of the Fighting Hawks' program.

With three-consecutive home games to open the campaign, the Fighting Hawks will be able to find their footing before a demanding stretch of away games dominates the rest of the non-conference slate.

"This year's schedule has more of a consistent flow to it unlike years past," Jones said. "This will benefit us from an overall evaluation of the team as we work our way through the non league schedule. Our ultimate goal is to be playing consistent basketball throughout Big Sky play."

The three-game homestand to open a season is the first for the program since the 2005-06 team went 4-1 at the Betty Englestad Sioux Center to begin that season. UND went 10-5 a season ago at home and hosted a CollegenInsider.com Postseason Tournament game for the first time in program history.

This year's 13-game home slate begins with Crown College on Nov. 11 and UND follows that up with a tilt against Mayville State on Nov. 15.

The Fighting Hawks open the Wright State Thanksgiving Invitational with a home game against Presentation College on Nov. 20 before traveling to Dayton, Ohio for the final three games of the event.

UND's first tilt in Ohio will be against North Florida on Nov. 25. The Ospreys have won back-to-back Atlantic Sun Conference titles and played in the 2015 NCAA Tournament and 2016 NIT Tournament.

Wright State, who is now coached by former South Dakota State head coach Scott Nagy, will be next up for the Fighting Hawks on Nov. 26. Nagy takes over a Raiders' program after 21 seasons with the Jackrabbits and inherits a squad that has won 20 games in three of the last four seasons.

The final opponent in the four-game tournament will be a CSU Bakersfield squad that won the Western Athletic Conference regular season and tournament titles a season ago and lost to Oklahoma in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Fighting Hawks and Roadrunners square off on Nov. 27.

December offers UND a challenging finish to non-conference play as the Fighting Hawks will play at North Dakota State (Dec. 7), at Northern Iowa (Dec. 10) and at Iowa (Dec. 20). The lone home game during that stretch is NDSU's return of the home-and-home series in Grand Forks on Dec. 16.

Jones added he is still trying to fill a home game on Dec. 2 before that daunting stretch against a trio of 20-win teams from a season ago. Both Northern Iowa and Iowa advanced in the NCAA Tournament a season ago and those hostile environments will bode well for a team that opens Big Sky play after Christmas on the road at Portland State (Dec. 29) and Sacramento State (Dec. 31).

"We're still looking to find another opponent that we can play at home in early December," Jones said. "The landscape of college basketball has changed so much in regards to scheduling in recent years. We have some challenges just like a lot of other schools with a similar demographic, but hopefully we can get one more home game scheduled here in the next week or so."

UND is entering its fifth season in the Big Sky and has made the league's tournament semifinals in three of its first four seasons as a league member. The Fighting Hawks' Big Sky home opener is set for Jan. 5 against Northern Arizona. Portland State (Mar. 2) and Sacramento State (Mar. 4) close out the regular season in Grand Forks before the Big Sky Tournament unfolds in Reno, Nev., for the second-straight year from March 6-11.
