## THE BLITZ

• The Fighting Hawks wrap up non-conference play this Saturday as they travel to Vermillion to take on South Dakota in what will be the only matchup of ranked opponents in the FCS this weekend.

• UND moved back into the top 10 of the STATS FCS and FCS Coaches' polls, landing in the No. 10 spot in both. South Dakota charged into the polls for the first time since the final week of the 2011 season compliments of a 2-0 start, including a 35-27 win at FBS-foe Bowling Green last Saturday. The Coyotes were ranked No. 23 in both polls this week.

• Kickoff at the DakotaDome for the 95th meeting between these two teams is scheduled for 2 p.m. UND owns a 10-7 record against the Coyotes at the indoor stadium that was built in 1979 and leads the all-time series 61-29-5.

• UND was the only Big Sky team to pick up a win in the first weekend of the "Challenge Series" created between the Big Sky and Missouri Valley Football Conference prior to the season. The MVFC won four of the five matchups, which all came on the road.

• The Fighting Hawks saved the league from being blanked in the win column thanks to a shutout of their own as they mashed Missouri State 34-0 in the 52nd-annual Potato Bowl.

• Four games remain in the series with two taking place this week. Besides the UND-USD matchup, Northern Iowa also travels to Southern Utah. The Panthers picked up a 45-38 overtime road win at Cal Poly last Saturday as part of the series.

• With the win over the Bears, UND now owns an 82-23 record in the 16-year-old history of the Alerus Center. The Fighting Hawks are 14-4 at home under fourth-year head coach **Bubba Schweigert**.

• The blanking of Missouri State was the first for Schweigert as UND's head coach. He returned the favor from a 38-0 loss dealt to him by the Bears during his first season back in 2014. For the program, the shutout was the first since the 2012 season opener against South Dakota Mines (66-0).

# 2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

• UND is now 10-0 in home openers during the Division I era, including a 47-44 double-overtime victory against South Dakota in last season's Potato Bowl. The overall streak is currently at 31-consecutive victories with the last loss coming in 1986 to Texas A&M-Kingsville (67-44).

**LAST TIME OUT: (11/11) NORTH DAKOTA 34, MISSOURI STATE 0**  
In Bubba Schweigert's third game as head coach at North Dakota back in 2014, UND was on the receiving end of a 38-0 Missouri State victory. Schweigert and the Fighting Hawks exacted a decisive measure of revenge on Saturday afternoon, pounding the Bears 34-0 in the 52nd annual Potato Bowl game.

Eleventh-ranked UND (1-1) broke things open with a 21-point outburst in the second quarter when sophomore wide receiver **Noah Wanzek** hauled in a pair of touchdown catches and **John Santiago** added a rushing score. That turned a 3-0 game into a 24-point lead for the home team, sending the Fighting Hawks to their fourth straight Potato Bowl win and their first Potato Bowl shutout since 2004.

The Bears had one serious scoring opportunity, but that was denied by senior **Chuck Flowers**, who stripped a Missouri State running back at the one-yard line and junior **Tanner Palmborg** was there to recover the loose ball.

## DID I CATCH A NINER IN THERE?

Through two games of the 2017 season, the trio of **De'mun Mercer**, **Travis Toivonen** and **Noah Wanzek** all share the the team lead with nine receptions a piece.

Wanzek was the key figure in the passing attack during the 34-0 blanking of Missouri State, finishing with career-highs in receptions (7), receiving yards (117) and receiving touchdowns (2). The 100-yard receiving game was also the first of Wanzek's career. He added a career-long, 47-yard catch to help set up his second scoring grab of the game that put UND ahead 17-0.

Wanzek leads the team with 167 yards, while Toivonen has 115 yards to his credit and Mercer has 86.

Toivonen led the team with 39 receptions as a true freshman in 2016, while Mercer was the team's top yardage producer, turning his 28 grabs into 553 yards (19.8 ypc).

## NOT THE FIRST TIME

Saturday's matchup won't be the first time these two teams have played against each other as ranked foes at the Division I level. Six years ago, both teams were ranked in the FCS Coaches' poll and playing for a Great West Conference title in Grand Forks in the final regular-season game of the campaign. Ranked No. 22, UND staged a thrilling comeback to knock off the 24th-ranked Coyotes 38-37. The home team scored three unanswered touchdowns in the fourth quarter to erase a 20-point deficit.

The Coyotes fell to 7-4 and 2-2 in league play and have not been ranked in either national poll until this week. UND finished 8-3 and 3-1 in Greate West Conference play to share the league title with Cal Poly.

### DID YOU KNOW?

South Dakota head coach **Bob Nielson** hired **Bubba Schweigert** to be his head coach at Minnesota-Duluth in 2004. Nielson had coached the Bulldogs from 1999-2003 before shifting into the athletics director's role at UMD. Schweigert spent four seasons there before taking the defensive coordinator position at Southern Illinois under form UND head coach Dale Lennon. Nielson returned to the sidelines following Schweigert's departure and spent five more seasons at UMD before moving onto Western Illinois (2013-15) and then eventually to South Dakota where he is embarking on his second season.

## POTATO BOWL USA HISTORY

- The Potato Bowl was created in 1965 by then UND Athletics Director Len Marti, head coach Marv Helling, assistant football coach Jerry Olson and sports information director Lee Bohnet.
- UND blanked Idaho State 41-0 in the first Potato Bowl game back in 1966 and posted their seventh overall shutout in the 52 years of the contest thanks to a 34-0 victory over Missouri State in this year's Potato Bowl. The Fighting Hawks now own a 41-11

all-time Potato Bowl record.

- The 47-44 double-overtime victory over South Dakota in the 2016 Potato Bowl marked the first overtime affair in the event. The Fighting Hawks erased a 20-point deficit in the final 18 minutes of the game to force the extra session.
- UND has won four-consecutive Potato Bowls and 21 of the last 24 games dating back to 1994.

# 2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

## WHAT'S NEXT?

UND returns home to face Montana State in what will be the program's final Big Sky opener on Saturday, Sept. 23. The Fighting Hawks held off the Bobcats in last year's league opener in Bozeman, escaping with a 17-15 victory. After dropping their first three Big Sky games to the Bobcats, UND has won back-to-back in the series that resumed in 2012. The teams had last played in 1983. UND will be an Independent, but play a Big Sky schedule in 2018 and 2019 before joining the Missouri Valley Conference in 2020.

## BACK TO NORMAL

A week after allowing Utah to rack up 272 rushing yards in a season-opening loss, the UND defense surrendered only 79 yards to Missouri State in the 34-0 Potato Bowl win.

The fact that Utah rushed for that much yardage was surprising on many fronts. Even though it was an FBS offense, the Utes became just the fourth team since head coach **Bubba Schweigert** took over the program in 2014 to rush for 200-plus yards in a game. Utah's 272 is the most rushing yards allowed during his tenure and was the most since Missouri State put up 235 ground yards in the 2014 meeting.

UND is usually the team putting up 200-plus ground yards in a game as Paul Rudolph's offense has now reached that plateau 18 times over the past three-plus seasons, including a 253-yard effort against the Bears. Those 18 contests include a trio of 400-plus rushing yardage outputs. The Utes' defense limited UND's vaunted rushing attack to just 55 yards in the opener -- it's fewest yards rushing since putting up 67 in last year's season opener at Stony Brook. Junior **Brady Oliveira** posted his sixth 100-yard rushing game with a team-best 164 yards vs. Missouri State. He averaged 10.2 ypc and had a long of 57 yards.



## 2017 BIG SKY/MISSOURI VALLEY FOOTBALL CHALLENGE

Big Sky and Missouri Valley Football Conference officials have formed a "Challenge Series" between the leagues that begins this weekend. The UND-Missouri State matchup is one of five between BSC and MVFC foes this Saturday and eight overall this season. The Fighting Hawks are in two of those and

all eight feature at least one team that was ranked in the STATS FCS Preseason Top 25 poll.

These two teams have faced off 83 times dating back to the MVFC's formation back in 1985. Thirty of those have been in the FCS Playoffs. The MVFC has won 50 of those contests, but the teams split eight meetings a season ago.

The BSC and MVFC are the only two conferences to send at least two teams to the FCS Playoffs since 1999 and the leagues have produced 13 National Champions.

# 2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

## SHIRTLESS IN SALT LAKE CITY

Defensive backs and Colorado natives **Hayden Blubaugh** and **Ty Shannon** both made their collegiate debuts in Salt Lake City against Utah. Blubaugh played as a reserve cornerback and kick returner, while Shannon played some safety late in the fourth quarter.

Classmate **Izzy Adeoti** also made the trip, but the rookie wide receiver did not see any game action. He ended up making his collegiate debut vs. Missouri State, catching one pass for seven yards and adding a five-yard rush.

## UND DEBUTS

Ten more Fighting Hawks joined Blubaugh and Shannon in making their UND debuts against the Utes. Redshirt freshman **Ryan Tobin**, was the only one among that dozen to garner a start as he debuted at left guard.

The remaining nine players to make UND debuts were outside linebacker **Jaxson Turner**, safety **Tamas Stewart**, running back **James Johannesson**, tight end **Hunter Pinke**, outside linebacker **Ray Haas**, outside linebacker **Andre Steiger**, inside linebacker **Corby Richman**, offensive lineman **Nathan Nguon** and tight end **Logan Alm**.

Besides **Izzy Adeoti**, several other Fighting Hawks made their debuts in the green and white. Redshirt freshmen **Noah Mortel** and **Sean Russo** both got reps along the offensive line, while linebacker **Jake Rastas** made three tackles and was credited with a half-a-sack vs. the Bears.

## FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Four defenders joined Tobin in making their first career starts in Salt Lake City. Junior **Austin Cieslak** started at defensive end and picked up a TFL on the first play of the game. **Jade Lawrence** (outside) and **Donnell Rodgers** (inside) garnered starts at linebacker and **Evan Holm** started at cornerback.

Lawrence finished with a career-high seven tackles, including a team-best two for a loss. Rodgers added four tackles and a sack, while Holm had a career-high eight tackles and corralled the second interception of his career against the Utes.

## CAPTAINS

The North Dakota football team will have two repeat captains in 2017 in seniors **Cole Reyes** and **Keaton Studsrud**. That duo will be flanked by classmate **Jake Disterhaupt** and junior running back **John Santiago** to form head coach Bubba Schweigert's quartet of captains this season.

## PRESEASON PUB

Besides appearing in the national polls, the North Dakota football team has also seen several of its players receive preseason accolades from various media outlets and organizations.

Senior safety **Cole Reyes** and junior running back **John Santiago** each found their names on multiple Preseason All-America teams. Reyes was named to the STATS FCS and *Athlon Sports* Preseason All-American First Team. He was also named the Big Sky Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and landed on the Preseason All-Big Sky Team.

Santiago was pegged to the same two Preseason All-America squads as a kick returner and was a unanimous selection on the Preseason All-Big Sky Team at running back. Reyes and San-

tiago were joined on the Preseason All-Big Sky Team by cornerback **Deion Harris**, running back **Brady Oliveira** and offensive guard **Demon Taylor**.

## CHART TOPPERS

A year after sharing its first Big Sky Conference title, the North Dakota football team was picked to repeat as the league champions in both the media and coaches' polls released in July at the Big Sky Kickoff in Park City, Utah.

Entering its sixth and final season as a league member, this marks the first time the Fighting Hawks garnered the top spot in either preseason poll. UND was picked to finish fourth by the media and fifth by the coaches last season before going on to post a unblemished 8-0 record in league play and share the regular season title with Eastern Washington.

## RUN STUFFERS

To no one's surprise, the North Dakota run defense was back at it in 2016. After leading the Big Sky each of the past two seasons in that category, the Fighting Hawks were tops once again. The unit yielded just 91.3 ypg (6th in the FCS) on the ground and gave up a season-low six yards to Northern Colorado (21 carries) in a 23-13 win over the Bears (Nov. 5). Former inside linebacker **Dylan Bakker** led the team with 98 tackles and was a second-team, All Big Sky honoree.

In the 31-24 win over the league's top rushing attack in Cal Poly (Oct. 1), UND held the Mustangs to a then season-low 202 ground yards. CP entered the game averaging an FCS-best 362.0 ypg. The Fighting Hawks were also the first team since Sam Houston State in the opening round of the 2012 FCS Playoffs to hold Cal Poly without a rushing touchdown.

## TEAMMATES AGAIN

There are three sets of high school teammates on the 2017 North Dakota football roster. Colorado natives **Bryce Blair** (OL) and **Tyus Carter** (DB) were prep teammates at Cherry Creek High School in Greenwood Village before joining the UND program prior to the 2015 season. Blair appeared in seven games during

the 2016 season and made his first career start at right tackle in the FCS Playoff game vs. Richmond. Edina High School in Minnesota boasts a pair of Fighting Hawks in **Bennett Helgren** (OL) and **Evan Holm** (DB). Holm played for the U.S.A. High School All-America Rugby Team in France and Belgium during the spring of 2016 and appeared in all 12 games as true freshman last year. Helgren redshirted, while nursing a back injury. Rounding out the sets of high school teammates are redshirt freshmen **Jordan Canady** (DB) and **Jake Rastas** (ILB), who played prep football together at Eisenhower High School in New Berlin, Wis. Both players are expected to contribute to the defense in 2017.

## BIG TEN BROS

Senior safety **Chuck Flowers** and junior **Luke Stanley** both have little brothers suiting up for teams in the Big Ten Conference. Flowers' brother Emmanuel is a true freshman defensive back at Michigan State, while Stanley's brother Nate is a sophomore quarterback for the Iowa Hawkeyes.

## HAVE MERCER

Texas State transfer De'mun Mercer gradually worked his way into a pivotal role in the offense and finished the season leading the team with 553 receiving yards. After not playing in the opener at Stony Brook (Sept. 1) and totalling just three catches for 64 yards through the first five games, Mercer had 25 receptions for 489 yards and four touchdowns in the last seven games. He became the first Fighting Hawk with a 100-yard receiving game this season when he caught seven passes for 147 yards and a touchdown in the regular-season finale vs. Northern Arizona (Nov. 12). Mercer added five receptions for 122 yards and two touchdowns in the FCS playoff loss to Richmond (Dec. 3). The last UND player with a 100-yard receiving game had been Clive Georges, who had five catches for 141 yards in the 2015 regular-season finale at Cal Poly (Nov. 21). Mercer's 19.8 ypc also topped the team.

## BRADY BUNCH

Sophomore **Brady Oliveira** accounted for a bunch of rushing touchdowns -- nine to be exact -- in league play during the 2016 season and also added the first passing touchdown of his career in the win over Northern Arizona (Nov. 12). He had rushed for at least one touchdown in the first seven league games before going through the air to account for his 10th touchdown of the season against the Lumberjacks. Oliveira added his team-leading 10th rushing score of the season in the FCS playoff loss to Richmond (Dec. 3).

## LUXURY BOOTS

The best position battle in fall camp may have been at punter where special teams coordinator **Shawn Kostich** has two solid options to choose from in seniors **Austin Dussold** and **Mitch Meindel**. Both players made the trip to Utah for the season opener and bring lofty credentials with them. Dussold averaged 42.4 ypp in 2016, which was his first season with UND after transferring from Missouri S&T (DII). Meindel returned to the roster after not playing in 2016 and he holds two of the best single-season ypp averages in program history, including the top one of 44.5 set as a junior in 2015. He also averaged 42.4 ypp as a true freshman in 2013, which is the eighth best single-season effort. His career average of 43.1 ypp is also tops on the UND Top 10 list for that category.

Dussold ended up winning the job for the first two games and so far has averaged 41.1 ypp on nine efforts. He has two landed four punts inside the 20-yard line and his best effort was a 50-yarder against Missouri State.

## DROP DOWNS

The 2017 roster will have a trio of players on it that began their careers at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. The newest member of that trio is running back **James Johannesson**, who spent two seasons with the Minnesota Gophers, but did not see any game action. He was a two-time North Dakota Gatorade Player of the Year in high school at Fargo South. Wide receiver **De'mun Mercer** begins his second season in the program. He led UND in receiving yards a year ago with 553. Mercer was second on the team with 28 receptions and had the only two 100-yard receiving games by a Fighting Hawk in 2016 (vs. NAU and vs. Richmond). The Winnsboro, La., native played his first two collegiate seasons at Texas State where he caught 28 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns during his career for the Bobcats.

Linebacker **Oscar Nevermann** is entering his third season with the program. Nevermann joined the program in the spring of 2015, but had to sit out that campaign after Wyoming did not grant his release. The Stockholm, Sweden native played linebacker for the Cowboys and shifted back to that position after playing in three games at running back in 2016 before an injury in game No. 3 his season short.

## 2016 YIELDS FIRST FCS PLAYOFF BERTH

After posting a perfect 8-0 record in Big Sky play and sharing the conference title with Eastern Washington, the Fighting Hawks were awarded the No. 7 national seed in the 2016 FCS Playoffs. The berth in the postseason tournament was the first for UND at the Division I level.

The Fighting Hawks were a first-timer in the FCS playoffs, but the program was no stranger to the postseason. UND registered a 20-12 overall record during its Division II era in postseason affairs, including a 17-12 mark in the DII playoffs. UND won the DII National Championship in 2001 and also appeared in the 2003 championship game. UND moved to the FCS level prior to the 2008 season.

## OSBORN ADDS NAME TO UND FOOTBALL LEGENDS AWARD

A member of the 1977 UND Athletics Hall of Fame Class, Dave Osborn is the only player in program history to have his number retired and is the 13th former player or coach to receive the award that was established in 2010. Osborn earned his Hall of Fame nod just a year after wrapping up a 12-year professional career that saw him earn All-Pro honors in 1969 after leading the Vikings to a berth in Super Bowl IX. The Cando, N.D. native rushed for more than 4,000 yards and played in three total Super Bowls during his time with the Vikings.

He was also named to UND's All-Century Team (1894-1994) and was one of 17 players from the 1960's that make up that 64-man squad. Several of those players were on hand to see Osborn accept the award in late July at the Legends Golf Club in Prior Lake, Minn., and more than 80 players and spouses from that distinguished decade took part in a special reunion earlier in the day.

## NICKNAME HISTORY

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a Grand Forks Herald account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's A Century of UND Sports, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the Dakota Student, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams operated without an official nickname, while the university continued the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history last fall. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

Former President Dr. Robert Kelley announced in mid-November that "Fighting Hawks" would be the University's new moniker and the UND football team played under that nickname in its 2015 season finale at Cal Poly -- a 45-21 victory over the Mustangs.

Just two weeks into the season, the 23rd-ranked Coyotes are halfway to their 2016 win total of four games and have done so in impressive fashion.

After scoring touchdowns on seven of their first eight possessions in the opening half at Drake en route to a 77-7 win over the Bulldogs, the Coyotes stayed on the road and knocked off FBS-foe Bowling Green (a team that beat UND 27-26 last season) 35-27 this past Saturday.

The offense's 56.0 ppg is tied for tops in the FCS and the units 554.5 yards per game is third best in the country.

Senior quarterback Chris Strevler has been named the Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks. He has accounted for 10 touchdowns, thrown for 550 yards and rushed for 164 yards in those two wins. He was also named the CFPA's FCS National Performer of the Week following the win over the Falcons.

Strevler threw for 217 yards and four touchdowns in last year's double-overtime loss to the Fighting Hawks. He also rushed for 91 yards, but threw a pair of costly picks that aided in UND's rally.

Twelve different Coyotes have registered at least one reception in the opening two weeks with freshmen Kody Case and Levi Falck leading the way with six catches a piece. Case, a true freshman, has turned his six grabs into 170 yards and two touchdowns.

Cornerback Danny Rambo leads the Coyotes with 12 total tackles in the early going and also has two tackles for loss. Linebacker Jim Litrenta is second on the team with 11 stops. That's the same perch he held last season when he accounted for 67 total tackles and a sack.

Redshirt freshman Phillip Powell, who is not listed on the Coyotes' two-deep, has two of USD's four picks early in the season.

Placekicker Ryan Reese has not been busy in the field-goal department, going 0-for-1, but he has connected on all 16 extra points for the Coyotes.

GRAND FORKS, N.D. -- North Dakota quarterback Keaton Studsrud scored on a one-yard keeper in double overtime to give the Fighting Hawks an incredible 47-44 Potato Bowl victory over South Dakota Saturday at Alerus Center.

UND (1-2) forced extra time after scoring the final 20 points of regulation, including 17 in the fourth quarter. That furious rally came immediately after the Coyotes (1-2), who were coming off a 21-point rally and double-overtime win of their own last week against Weber State, had blown the game open with 28 unanswered points.

UND is no stranger to rallying against the Coyotes, having mustered a 21-point, fourth-quarter rally the last time these two squads met in 2011. The script was eerily similar to that 38-37 win five seasons ago for the Fighting Hawks, who have now won 30 straight home openers, including all 15 at the Alerus Center.

Trailing 34-14 late in the third quarter, UND kicker Reid Taubenheim broke USD's scoring run with a 32-yard field goal that made it a 34-17 game. Sophomore John Santiago then reeled in a 7-yard back shoulder throw from Studsrud three-and-a-half minutes into the final quarter to pull UND to within 10 points.

It was the first career receiving touchdown for Santiago, who had his 11th 100-yard rushing game in 14 collegiate tries and second-straight on the campaign. He finished with 22 carries for 140 yards.

Taubenheim connected again from 28 yards out six minutes later, making it a one-score game. Then, UND cornerback Deion Harris stepped in front of a Chris Streveler pass and took it back 33 yards for his second pick-six in as many games, tying the game at 34 and forcing overtime.

On the first play of the first overtime series, Santiago took it the distance from 25 yards out, but the Coyotes answered on their first play of overtime. Streveler found Shamar Jackson over the middle just inside the goal line. The USD signal caller finished with four touchdown strikes and 215 passing yards.

USD kicker Miles Bergner opened double overtime with a 37-yard field goal to give the Coyotes a 44-41 lead. With UND in need of a touchdown to win, Santiago appeared to have done just that from five yards out. But the touchdown ruling on the field was overturned on video review. Two tries later from inside the 1-yard line, Studsrud followed the left side of his line into the end zone, capping off a wild and much-needed celebration for a UND team that had lost its first two games by a combined five points.

UND safety Cole Reyes opened the scoring for the home team with a pick-six in the first quarter and Studsrud found Travis Toivonen from 11 yards out for the rookie's first receiving touchdown to make it a 14-6 contest.

## BUBBA SCHWEIGERT HEAD COACH

Bubba Schweigert has developed a nice pattern through his first three seasons as the head football coach at North Dakota. Each year his squad produced two more victories than the previous one and 2016 was no exception as he was named the Big Sky and FCS Region 5 Coach of the Year.

The Fighting Hawks shared the Big Sky Conference regular season title with Eastern Washington, reeled off a 9-game winning streak and earned the No. 7 overall seed in the Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs in 2016.

After losing the first two games of the season by a combined four points, a double-overtime victory against South Dakota launched UND into Big Sky play where the Fighting Hawks ran the table. There were tight games and lopsided games, but his team always found a way to come out on top in league play and give UND its first undefeated conference record since Dale Lennon's 2003 squad went 7-0 in North Central Conference play.

The defense was once again the top-rated run unit in the league and sixth-best in the FCS. The unit was also tops in the Big Sky with 20 interceptions and tied for second nationally, trailing only national champion James Madison in that category.

Four Fighting Hawks earned All-America accolades, including safety Cole Reyes, who landed on six different All-America squads. The junior captain was also named the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year. Reyes was one of 15 UND players to earn All-Big Sky honors on the field, while 18 set a program record by being named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team. Senior Brian Labat led those efforts in the classroom and also earned CoSIDA All-District 6 Team honors.

Schweigert wrapped up the 2015 season with what was the first three-game winning streak of his UND head-coaching tenure. Those three victories gave his second UND squad a 7-4 overall record and 5-3 mark in Big Sky play, which were both two-game improvements from his first season back in Grand Forks.

Schweigert's defense led the Big Sky in rushing defense for the second straight season under his watch and the offense improved immensely thanks in large part to the record-breaking production of true freshman running back John Santiago.

After a 4-3 start that included the program's first victory over an FBS opponent (24-13 win at Wyoming) and first DI road victory over a ranked opponent (19-17 win; No. 16 Portland State), the Fighting Hawks would go on to post the program's first seven-win season since 2011.

Santiago was named the Co-Big Sky Freshman of the Year and collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and STATS, Inc. He was also a unanimous All-Big Sky first team performer and was joined on that team by senior linebacker Will Ratelle and offensive lineman Sean Meehan, who was also named to the AFCA All-America Team.

Eight more Fighting Hawks would garner all-league honors in 2015 as the defense once again ranked among the tops in the Big Sky, ranking first in rush defense and second in total defense. In the classroom, 17 UND football players were named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team, breaking the previous year's record by one.

In his first season back at UND, Schweigert's 2014 squad won five games overall, which was a two-game improvement from the previous season. The campaign was highlighted by a 30-28 upset of No. 22 Northern Arizona in the final home game of the season at the Alerus Center. UND took the positive vibes from a victory that knocked NAU out of the

# 2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

FSC playoff hunt to Greely, Colo., the next Saturday where the team closed out the season with its first Big Sky road win of the season -- a 33-14 defeat of Northern Colorado.

The defensive-minded head coach still works with the team's cornerbacks and they were part of a unit that led the Big Sky in total defense and rush defense in 2014. Two newcomers earned All-Big Sky Conference honors (KR Alex Tillman and PK Reid Taubenheim) and seven more players were named honorable mention in Schweigert's first season.

There were also 16 UND football players named to the All-Big Sky Academic team, which tied a program record for individuals honored in one season.

The Zeeland, N.D., native returned to Grand Forks after 10 years away from a program that he helped lead to the 2001 NCAA Division II national title as defensive coordinator.

Prior to his return to UND, Schweigert was the defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois for the previous six seasons (2008-13) and served as associate head coach for the last five of that stretch. His 2010 defense led the Missouri Valley in total defense and his unit finished in the top half of the league in four of his six campaigns at SIU.

In his six seasons at SIU, Schweigert coached three first team All-Americans and 20 all-conference selections (10 first team, six second team, four honorable mentions). His defensive standouts have included linebacker and 2012 graduate Jayson DiManche, currently playing for Cincinnati Bengals, and cornerback Korey Lindsey, a three-time All-American and a 2011 draft pick of the Bengals. In 2013, SIU linebacker Bryan Presume earned first team All-MVFC honors after ranking third in the league with 104 tackles. His 55 solo stops were tops in the conference.

Prior to arriving at SIU, Schweigert took on his first head coaching job at the collegiate level, leading the Division II program at Minnesota Duluth from 2004-07. He guided the Bulldogs to a 22-21 overall record during his tenure, including the program's first North Central Conference title in 2005. The NCAA playoff berth that season was the program's second in four seasons. That same season, Schweigert was also named the D2football.com Northwest Region Coach of the Year and the AFCA Division II Coach of the Year for Region 5.

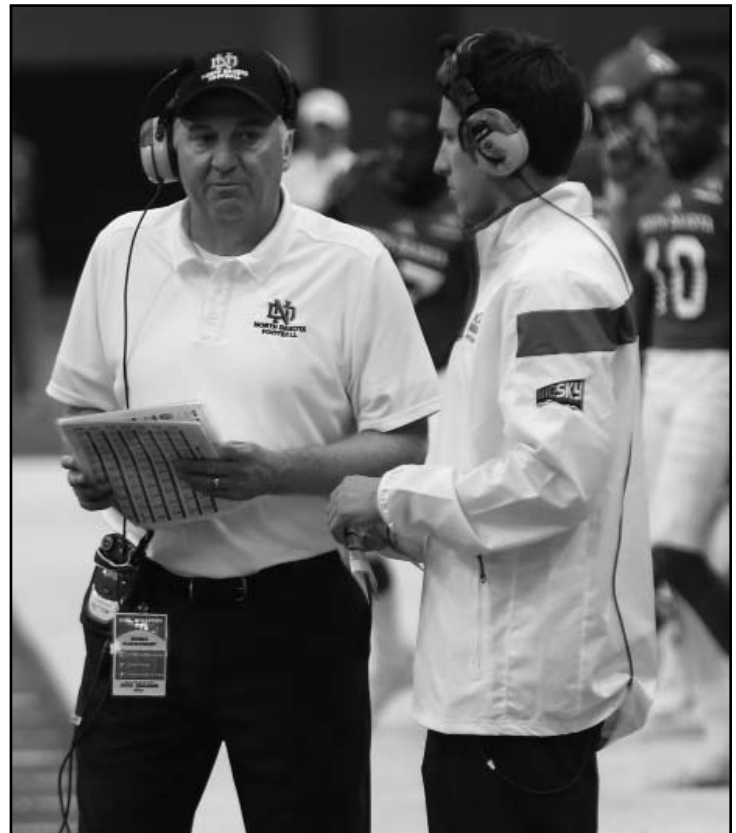
This will be the second stint at UND for Schweigert. He spent 15 seasons as an assistant coach in Grand Forks (1989-2003) where he was part of eight NCAA playoff teams and six NCC title squads.

Schweigert was elevated to defensive coordinator at UND prior to the 1997 season and left for Duluth after the 2003 UND team finished as national runner-up. Schweigert was named the American Football Coaches Association Division II Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In his seven seasons as UND's defensive coordinator, Schweigert's defensive players earned 14 All-America honors and 23 first-team All-NCC accolades. His 2001 defense yielded just 191.4 yards of offense and 50.3 rushing yards per game, while limiting opponents to 12.5 points per game on the way to the program's first national championship.

Schweigert began his coaching career at his alma mater, now the University of Jamestown, from 1985-

**SALT LAKE CITY, Utah** -- 25th-ranked Utah outlasted Eighth-ranked North Dakota 37-16 in a matchup of ranked opponents from their respective levels of college football. The Football Bowl Subdivision's Utes won their 10th-straight season opener by outgaining the Football Championship Subdivision's Fighting Hawks 499-238 in total offense and by outrushing the visitors 272-51.

"One thing that I asked our team to do was play hard for 60 minutes and I think our guys did that tonight," UND head coach Bubba Schweigert said. "Could we play better? Sure. I think we can execute better.

"Defensively, (Darren) Carrington hurt us. We always want to tackle better and we take a lot of pride in tackling. We probably didn't do that as well as we needed to. Offensively, we want to run the ball with more consistency, but we knew that would be a challenge coming into the game."

The Utes' defensive front bottled up the All-Big Sky running back duo of John Santiago and Brady Oliveira, holding them to a combined 35 yards on 17 attempts. Quarterback Keaton Studsrud went 13-for-28 through the air for 175 yards and a touchdown, but the offense could never gain any traction in front of the 45th-straight sellout at Rice-Eccles Stadium. Studsrud went 3-for-3 for 76 yards on UND's lone touchdown drive that cut a fourth-quarter deficit to 27-16, but the Utes would get the final 10 points to end any thoughts of an upset.

Sophomore Travis Toivonen led UND with four receptions for 64 yards, while senior De'mun Mercer added three grabs for 32 yards. The Fighting Hawks were within a score at halftime thanks to the leg of placekicker Reid Taubenheim, who made all three of his field goal attempts in the opening 30 minutes. His 43-yard connection with two seconds remaining in the half made it a 17-9 contest.

Utah quarterback Tyler Huntley had an impressive collegiate debut after throwing an interception on his opening drive. UND's Evan Holm corralled that pick with a diving grab that set up Taubenheim's first field goal of the day from 32 yards out. Huntley settled down after that and went 23-for-32 through the air for 227 yards and added 70 rushing yards, while accounting for three of the Utes' four touchdowns.

The sophomore had two of those on the ground and the first was a 16-yard scamper with his team facing a 4th-and-1 early in the second quarter that put the Utes on the board. His throwing strike went to Carrington, who had 10 catches for 127 yards in his Utah debut after transferring from Pac-12 rival Oregon.

UND senior Jake Disterhaupt, who was making his first career start at inside linebacker, finished with a career-high 14 tackles to lead all players. He was one of four Fighting Hawks to register a new career-high in tackles.

**GRAND FORKS, N.D.** -- In Bubba Schweigert's third game as head coach at North Dakota back in 2014, UND was on the receiving end of a 38-0 Missouri State victory. Schweigert and the Fighting Hawks exacted a decisive measure of revenge on Saturday afternoon, pounding the Bears 34-0 in the 52nd annual Potato Bowl USA game.

Eleventh-ranked UND (1-1) broke things open with a 21-point outburst in the second quarter when sophomore wide receiver Noah Wanzek hauled in a pair of touchdown catches and John Santiago added a rushing score. That turned a 3-0 game into a 24-point lead for the home team, sending the Fighting Hawks to their fourth straight Potato Bowl win and their first Potato Bowl shutout since 2004.

The shutout was also the first of the Schweigert era and first overall for the program since the 2012 season opener, a 66-0 blanking of South Dakota Mines.

"I won't say we expected a shutout, but that's the goal every time we go out there," Schweigert said. "It was a good team win. We still have some things to clean up, but anytime you can run the ball the way we did and stop the run like we did, you're going to give yourself a chance for a positive result and that's we got today."

UND had chances early to break the game up open, but two trips inside the Bears' red zone in the opening quarter only yielded a 25-yard field goal by Senior Reid Taubenheim. The second quarter was a different story, however, as the home team scored touchdowns on its first three possessions to make it a 24-0 contest by halftime.

The Fighting Hawks racked up 526 yards of total offense, keyed by Wanzek's career-high 117 yards on seven catches. Keaton Studsrud was his typical efficient self, completing 22 of 31 passes for 273 yards and those two scoring strikes to Wanzek.

Junior Brady Oliveira paced the ground game with 16 carries for 164 yards, while Santiago and sophomore James Johannesson both added rushing scores in the victory. Johannesson's 19-yard rumble where he dragged several Bear defenders into the end zone with him, capped the scoring for the Fighting Hawks.

Defensively, UND blanked a Missouri State team that totaled 43 points last week at FBS-foe Missouri. The unit also forced three turnovers, including a key stop in the third quarter where the Bears had penetrated all the way down to the UND eight-yard line. Jason Randall picked up seven yards and was closing in on the goalline when he was stripped by Charles Flowers and the loose ball was recovered by linebacker Tanner Palmborg.

Flowers and classmate Cole Reyes shared the team-lead with seven tackles as the defense yielded only 211 total yards. UND dominated the time of possession (36:11 to 23:49) and ran 28 more offensive plays than the Bears in the contest (76 to 48).
