THE BLITZ

• Fresh off its best offensive output since the 2013 season opener, the North Dakota football team returns to action Saturday at No. 24 Montana in a Big Sky matchup on ROOT Sports. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. CT.

• The Fighting Hawks snapped a three-game skid with their offensive outburst last Saturday that resulted in a 48-38 Homecoming victory over Northern Colorado. • Those 48 points were the most score in Bubba Schweigert's 41 games as UND's head coach and most since a 69-10 victory over Valparaiso in 2013 (Aug. 29). It was the seventh time during Schweigert's tenure that UND exceeded the 40-point plateau.

• The offense also piled up season-highs in total offense (562) and rushing yards (314). The 562 total yards has only been topped once during the Schweigert era (625 at Sacramento State; 2016) and the rushing yards is the fourth-best total.

• Montana owns a 14-8-1 advantage in the all-time series with UND and has won four of the five meetings at the Division I level. The teams played to a 10-10 tie in their first meeting back in 1915.

• This will be UND's third trip to Washington-Grizzly Stadium and the Fighting Hawks are still in search of their first win in the venue that was built in 1986. The teams did not play between 1974-2009.

• Montana won the last matchup 42-16, which was also played on the Grizzlies' home turf. UND scored a touchdown on its opening play from scrimmage and led 10-7 midway through the second quarter, but the Griz would reel off five-straight touchdowns over the next 20 minutes to put the game away.

• Senior quarterback **Keaton Studsrud** missed that contest in 2015 with a shoulder injury. He returned the following the week and led UND to three-straight victories to close out the season. He has started 30 of UND's last 33 games.

• The Griz will be the third ranked opponent UND has faced in 2017 after opening at No. 25 Utah (37-16; L) and falling at No. 17 South Dakota (45-7), who has now moved all the way up to No. 4 in both the STATS FCS and FCS Coaches' poll.

2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: UND 48, NORTHERN COLORADO 38

The Fighting Hawks snapped a three-game losing streak after registering a 48-38 win over Northern Colorado last Saturday at the Alerus Center. Senior **Keaton Studsrud** threw for 248 yards and added 97 on the ground, while sophomore **Travis Toivonen** added two ground scores on reverses from his wide out position. UND built an early 28-7 advantage only to see the Bears rip off 24-straight points to briefly reclaim the lead. The Fighting Hawks break a 38-38 tie by outscoring UNC 10-0 in the fourth quarter.

WHAT'S NEXT?

UND will return to the Alerus Center next Saturday for a contest against Sacramento State. Kickoff against the Hornets is at 12:30 p.m. CT and fans are encouraged to wear green for the annual "Green Out" game.

HAPPY HOMECOMING

- With the 48-38 win over the Bears (Oct. 7), UND now owns a 64-31-4 all-time record in Homecoming contests.
- The 48 points were the most scored in a Homecoming game by UND at the Division I level and in the Alerus Center. The output was also the most in a Homecoming Game since a 54-6 victory over Augustana in the last one played at Memorial Stadium in 2000.
- The victory over the Bears improved UND's record to 10-7 in Homecoming contests since moving into the Alerus Center in 2001.

ATTENDANCE SPIKE

With 12,342 on hand to watch the Montana State game (Sept. 23), the Fighting Hawks drew crowds of 12,000-plus in back-to-back games for the first time since the Alerus Center opened in 2001. That attendance figure also marked the first sellout since the 2009 season opener against South Dakota (12,431). Back in the inaugural season of UND's indoor stadium, the NDSU game drew a single-game attendance record of 13,500 (Oct. 6) that still stands and two weeks later, 12,580 watched the UND-Omaha game (Oct. 20).

GROUND GAME FINDS AN OLD GEAR

After being held to 204 combined rushing yards in losses at South Dakota and to Montana State in the Big Sky opener, UND's ground game has churned out a total of 608 yards in the past two games.

The junior tandem of **John Santiago** and **Brady Oliveira** has accounted for 456 of those. Oliveira has eclipsed the 100-yard mark in both contests, while Santiago managed 70 yards and a touchdown against the Bears after rushing for a season-high 170 in the loss at UC Davis (Sept. 30).

The All-Big Sky duo has rushed for 100 yards in the same game twice now during their careers after achieving that feat against the Aggies (first was vs. Montana State; 2015). Santiago now has 14 career 100-yard games and Oliveira has eight.

Santiago's 81-yard touchdown run against UC Davis (Sept. 30) matched his career long set against Northern Colorado during his freshman season.

CLOYD, PINKE ADD SCORING PUNCH

A week after fellow tight end **Hunter Pinke** found the end zone for the first time on a 36-yard reception, sophomore **Alex Cloyd** had a scoring grab in the 48-38 win over Northern Colorado. Cloyd's grab came from 21 yards out and he added a 37-yard catch later in the game to finish with a career-best 58 receiving yards.

Pinke's scoring grab came on his first career catch and he added a 14-yard reception against the Bears. Cloyd and Pinke have seen their playing time increase with junior **Luke Fielder** sitting out the previous two games.

STEPPING UP

JUCO-transfer **Tamas Stewart** made his first career start against UC Davis (Sept. 30), filling in for injured All-American **Cole Reyes**. He played a majority of the Montana State game (Sept. 23) as well for Reyes and registered 10 tackles in back-to-back games. nia for the tilt. Stewart was one of four Fighting Hawks to net double-figure tackles in the contest. Redshirt freshman **Jake Rastas** led the way with a career-high 13 tackles, while senior captain **Jake Disterhaupt** and true freshman **Hayden Blubaugh** also had 10 tackles a piece.

Disterhaupt leads the team with 51 tackles, but was out of action in the Homecoming win over Northern Colorado (Oct. 7). Classmate **Oscar Nevermann** made his first career start in place of Disterhaupt and helped UND limit the Bears to a season-low 18 yards on 22 carries. Blubaugh, a true freshman, also made his first career start against UNC and finished with six tackles.

2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

INJURY BUG

This week's injury report features 11 names that have started multiple games in their careers or were counted on to be in the 2017 two-deep entering the campaign. All-American **Deion Harris** was lost for the season before it started and fellow All-American and reigning Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year **Cole Reyes** has missed the last two games and will be out against at Montana (Oct. 14). Sophomore linebacker **Donnell Rodgers** (Missouri State; Sept. 23), senior wide receiver **Josh Seibel** (fall camp) and junior wide receiver **Luke Stanley** (preseason) are all out indefinitely, and six more are considered questionable for this Saturday's game against Montana.

Five of them all have at least one start under their belts in 2017 (tight end Luke Fielder; 4), inside linebacker **Jake Disterhaupt**; 5, fullback **Kyle Norberg**; 1 and offensive lineman **A.J. Stockwell**; 3). Senior offensive lineman **Mat Cox** returned to action against the Aggies (Sept. 30), while redshirt freshman linebacker **Cam Hunt** was taken off the injury report and made his UND debut against the Bears (Oct. 7).

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Redshirt freshman **Cam Hunt** provided a boost to the inside linebacker position that has been ravaged by injuries. After missing the first five games with an injury of his own, the Carmel, Ind., native picked off a pass on just his third collegiate snap and added a tackle for loss later in the contest. UND turned Hunt's pick into a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage to push its lead to 21-7. Hunt was named UND's 2016 Defensive Scout of the Year during his redshirt season.



2017 BIG SKY/MISSOURI VALLEY FOOTBALL CHALLENGE

Big Sky and Missouri Valley Football Conference officials have formed a "Challenge Series" between the leagues that begins this weekend. The UND-Missouri State matchup is one of five between BSC and MVFC foes this Saturday and eight overall this season. The Fighting Hawks are in two of those and

all eight feature at least one team that was ranked in the STATS FCS Preseason Top 25 poll.

These two teams have faced off 83 times dating back to the MVFC's formation back in 1985. Thirty of those have been in the FCS Playoffs. The MVFC has won 50 of those contests, but the teams split eight meetings a season ago.

The BSC and MVFC are the only two conferences to send at least two teams to the FCS Playoffs since 1999 and the leagues have produced 13 National Champions.

2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

FLOWERS DELIVERS

Senior **Chuck Flowers** is one of five UND defenders to start every game this season and in his first year as a start, the Chino Hills, Calif., native ranks second on the team in tackles with 42 and closed out the Northern Colorado game with an interception in the end zone. A blitz by Flowers also forced the errant throw that resulted in **Cam Hunt's** second-quarter interception.

STUCK IN NEUTRAL NO LONGER

UND's offense had managed only six first-quarter points through its first four games, but junior **John Santiago** quickly matched that total on the Fighting Hawks' second play from scrimmage at UC Davis when he raced 81 yards for a touchdown to equal his best career run (vs. UNC; 2015). The Fighting Hawks finished with 10 points in that quarter and added 14 against Northern Colorado.

SHIRTLESS IN SALT LAKE CITY

Defensive backs and Colorado natives **Hayden Blubaugh** and **Ty Shannon** both made their collegiate debuts in Salt Lake City against Utah (Aug. 31) in the season opener. Blubaugh played as a reserve cornerback and kick returner, while Shannon played some safety late in the fourth quarter.

Classmate **Izzy Adeoti** also made the trip, but the rookie wide receiver did not see any game action. He ended up making his collegiate debut vs. Missouri State (Sept. 9), catching one pass for seven yards and adding a five-yard rush.

That trio provided its biggest impact so far this season against UC Davis (Sept. 30). Adeoti had two catches for 19 yards, which were both season highs, while Blubaugh (10) and Shannon (4) added season-highs in tackles. Blubaugh also had the first two pass break-ups of his career against the Aggies.

UND DEBUTS

Ten more Fighting Hawks joined Blubaugh and Shannon in making their UND debuts against the Utes. Redshirt freshman **Ryan Tobin**, was the only one among that dozen to garner a start as he debuted at left guard.

The remaining nine players to make UND debuts were outside linebacker **Jaxson Turner**, safety **Tamas Stewart**, running back **James Johannesson**, tight end **Hunter Pinke**, outside linebacker **Ray Haas**, outside linebacker **Andre Steiger**, inside linebacker **Corby Richman**, offensive lineman **Nathan Nguon** and tight end **Logan Alm**.

Besides **Izzy Adeoti**, several other Fighting Hawks made their debuts in the green and white. Redshirt freshmen **Noah Mortel** and **Sean Russo** both got reps along the offensive line, while linebacker **Jake Rastas** made three tackles and was credited with a half-a-sack vs. the Bears.

Redshirt freshman **Cam Hunt** returned from a spring injury to make his UND debut in the Homecoming win over Northern Colorado.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Four defenders joined Tobin in making their first career starts in Salt Lake City. Junior **Austin Cieslak** started at defensive end and picked up a TFL on the first play of the game. **Jade Lawrence** (outside) and **Donnell Rodgers** (inside) garnered starts at linebacker and **Evan Holm** started at cornerback.

Lawrence finished with a career-high seven tackles, including a team-best two for a loss. Rodgers added four tackles and a sack, while Holm had a career-high eight tackles and corralled the second interception of his career against the Utes.

2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

Redshirt freshman **Jake Rastas** added his name to the list of first-time starters this season against South Dakota (Sept. 16). Rastas was one of three Fighting Hawks to post double-figure tackles in the game, finishing with 11 against the Coyotes.

Classmate **Noah Mortel** earned his first start a week later in the Big Sky opener vs. Montana State (Sept. 23). He played all the offensive snaps at left tackle against the Bobcats.

Defensive backs **Tamas Stewart** (Sept. 30 vs. UC Davis) and **Hayden Blubaugh** (Oct. 7 vs. UNC) have added their names to the growing list of first-time starters.

POTATO BOWL USA HISTORY

- The Potato Bowl was created in 1965 by then UND Athletics Director Len Marti, head coach Marv Helling, assistant football coach Jerry Olson and sports information director Lee Bohnet.
- UND blanked Idaho State 41-0 in the first Potato Bowl game back in 1966 and posted their seventh overall shutout in the 52 years of the contest thanks to a 34-0 victory over Missouri State in this year's Potato Bowl. The Fighting Hawks now own a 41-11 all-time Potato Bowl record.
- The 47-44 double-overtime victory over South Dakota in the 2016 Potato Bowl marked the first overtime affair in the event. The Fighting Hawks erased a 20-point deficit in the final 18 minutes of the game to force the extra session.
- UND has won four-consecutive Potato Bowls and 21 of the last 24 games dating back to 1994.

CAPTAINS

The North Dakota football team will have two repeat captains in 2017 in seniors **Cole Reyes** and **Keaton Studsrud**. That duo will be flanked by classmate **Jake Disterhaupt** and junior running back **John Santiago** to form head coach Bubba Schweigert's quartet of captains this season.

PRESEASON PUB

Besides appearing in the national polls, the North Dakota football team has also seen several of its players receive preseason accolades from various media outlets and organizations.

Senior safety **Cole Reyes** and junior running back **John Santiago** each found their names on multiple Preseason All-America teams. Reyes was named to the STATS FCS and *Athlon Sports* Preseason All-American First Team. He was also named the Big Sky Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and landed on the Preseason All-Big Sky Team.

Santiago was pegged to the same two Preseason All-America squads as a kick returner and was a unanimous selection on the Preseason All-Big Sky Team at running back. Reyes and Santiago were joined on the Preseason All-Big Sky Team by cornerback **Deion Harris**, running back **Brady Oliveira** and offensive guard **Demon Taylor**.

CHART TOPPERS

A year after sharing its first Big Sky Conference title, the North Dakota football team was picked to repeat as the league champions in both the media and coaches' polls released in July at the Big Sky Kickoff in Park City, Utah.

Entering its sixth and final season as a league member, this marks the first time the Fighting Hawks garnered the top spot in either preseason poll. UND was picked to finish fourth by the media and fifth by the coaches last season before going on to post

a unblemished 8-0 record in league play and share the regular season title with Eastern Washington.

RUN STUFFERS

To no one's surprise, the North Dakota run defense was back at it in 2016. After leading the Big Sky each of the past two seasons in that category, the Fighting Hawks were tops once again. The unit yielded just 91.3 ypg (6th in the FCS) on the ground and gave up a season-low six yards to Northern Colorado (21 carries) in a 23-13 win over the Bears (Nov. 5). Former inside linebacker **Dylan Bakker** led the team with 98 tackles and was a second-team, All Big Sky honoree.

In the 31-24 win over the league's top rushing attack in Cal Poly (Oct. 1), UND held the Mustangs to a then season-low 202 ground yards. CP entered the game averaging an FCS-best 362.0 ypg. The Fighting Hawks were also the first team since Sam Houston State in the opening round of the 2012 FCS Playoffs to hold Cal Poly without a rushing touchdown.

TEAMMATES AGAIN

There are three sets of high school teammates on the 2017 North Dakota football roster. Colorado natives **Bryce Blair** (OL) and **Tyus Carter** (DB) were prep teammates at Cherry Creek High School in Greenwood Village before joining the UND program prior to the 2015 season. Blair appeared in seven games during the 2016 season and made his first career start at right tackle in the FCS Playoff game vs. Richmond. Edina High School in Minnesota boasts a pair of Fighting Hawks in **Bennett Helgren** (OL) and **Evan Holm** (DB). Holm played for the U.S.A. High School All-America Rugby Team in France and Belgium during the spring of 2016 and appeared in all 12 games as true freshman last year. Helgren redshirted, while nursing a back injury. Rounding out the sets of high school teammates are redshirt freshmen **Jordan Canady** (DB) and **Jake Rastas** (ILB), who played prep football together at Eisenhower High School in New Berlin, Wis. Both players are expected to contribute to the defense in 2017.

2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

BIG TEN BROS

Senior safety **Chuck Flowers** and junior **Luke Stanley** both have little brothers suiting up for teams in the Big Ten Conference. Flowers' brother Emmanuel is a true freshman defensive back at Michigan State, while Stanley's brother Nate is a sophomore quarterback for the Iowa Hawkeyes.

HAVE MERCER

Texas State transfer De'mun Mercer gradually worked his way into a pivotal role in the offense and finished the season leading the team with 553 receiving yards. After not playing in the opener at Stony Brook (Sept. 1) and totalling just three catches for 64 yards through the first five games, Mercer had 25 receptions for 489 yards and four touchdowns in the last seven games. He became the first Fighting Hawk with a 100-yard receiving game this season when he caught seven passes for 147 yards and a touchdown in the regular-season finale vs. Northern Arizona (Nov. 12). Mercer added five receptions for 122 yards and two touchdowns in the FCS playoff loss to Richmond (Dec. 3). The last UND player with a 100-yard receiving game had been Clive Georges, who had five catches for 141 yards in the 2015 regular-season finale at Cal Poly (Nov. 21). Mercer's 19.8 ypc also topped the team in 2016.

BRADY BUNCH

Brady Oliveira accounted for a bunch of rushing touchdowns -- nine to be exact -- in league play during the 2016 season and also added the first passing touchdown of his career in the win over Northern Arizona (Nov. 12). He rushed for at least one touchdown in the first seven league games before going through the air to account for his 10th touchdown against the Lumberjacks. Oliveira added his team-leading 10th rushing score of the season in the FCS playoff loss to Richmond (Dec. 3).

LUXURY BOOTS

The best position battle in fall camp may have been at punter where special teams coordinator **Shawn Kostich** has two solid options to choose from in seniors **Austin Dussold** and **Mitch Meindel**. Both players made the trip to Utah for the season opener and bring lofty credentials with them. Dussold averaged 42.4 ypp in 2016, which was his first season with UND after transferring from Missouri S&T (DII). Meindel returned to the roster after not playing in 2016 and he holds two of the best single-season ypp averages in program history, including the top one of 44.5 set as a junior in 2015. He also averaged 42.4 ypp as a true freshman in 2013, which is the eighth best single-season effort. His career average of 43.1 ypp is also tops on the UND Top 10 list for that category.

Dussold ended up winning the job for the first two games and so far has averaged 39.0 ypp on 27 attempts. He has two landed eight punts inside the 20-yard line and his best effort was a 50-yarder against Missouri State (Sept. 9).

DROP DOWNS

The 2017 roster will have a trio of players on it that began their careers at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. The newest member of that trio is running back **James Johannesson**, who spent two seasons with the Minnesota Gophers, but did not see any game action. He was a two-time North Dakota Gatorade Player of the Year in high school at Fargo South. Wide receiver **De'mun Mercer** begins his second season in the program. He led UND in receiving yards a year ago with 553. Mercer was second on the team with 28 receptions and had the only two 100-yard receiving games by a Fighting Hawk in 2016 (vs. NAU and vs.

Richmond). The Winnsboro, La., native played his first two collegiate seasons at Texas State where he caught 28 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns during his career for the Bobcats.

Linebacker **Oscar Nevermann** is entering his third season with the program. Nevermann joined the program in the spring of 2015, but had to sit out that campaign after Wyoming did not grant his release. The Stockholm, Sweden native played linebacker for the Cowboys and shifted back to that position after playing in three games at running back in 2016 before an injury in game No. 3 his season short.

2016 YIELDS FIRST FCS PLAYOFF BERTH

After posting a perfect 8-0 record in Big Sky play and sharing the conference title with Eastern Washington, the Fighting Hawks were awarded the No. 7 national seed in the 2016 FCS Playoffs. The berth in the postseason tournament was the first for UND at the Division I level.

The Fighting Hawks were a first-timer in the FCS playoffs, but the program was no stranger to the postseason. UND registered a 20-12 overall record during its Division II era in postseason affairs, including a 17-12 mark in the DII playoffs. UND won the DII National Championship in 2001 and also appeared in the 2003 championship game. UND moved to the FCS level prior to the 2008 season.

OSBORN ADDS NAME TO UND FOOTBALL LEGENDS AWARD

A member of the 1977 UND Athletics Hall of Fame Class, Dave Osborn is the only player in program history to have his number retired and is the 13th former player or coach to receive the award that was established in 2010. Osborn earned his Hall of Fame nod just a year after wrapping up a 12-year professional career that saw him earn All-Pro honors in 1969 after leading the Vikings to a berth in Super Bowl IX. The Cando, N.D. native rushed for more than 4,000 yards and played in three total Super Bowls during his time with the Vikings.

He was also named to UND's All-Century Team (1894-1994) and was one of 17 players from the 1960's that make up that 64-man squad. Several of those players were on hand to see Osborn accept the award in late July at the Legends Golf Club in Prior Lake, Minn., and more than 80 players and spouses from that distinguished decade took part in a special reunion earlier in the day.

NICKNAME HISTORY

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a Grand Forks Herald account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's A Century of UND Sports, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the Dakota Student, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams operated without an official nickname, while the university continued the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history last fall. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

Former President Dr. Robert Kelley announced in mid-November that "Fighting Hawks" would be the University's new moniker and the UND football team played under that nickname in its 2015 season finale at Cal Poly -- a 45-21 victory over the Mustangs.

Head coach **Bob Stitt** has the Grizzlies back in the top 25 after a 4-2 start to the 2017 season. Montana has won two straight Big Sky -road games after allowing Eastern Washington to rally for a 48-41 victory in Missoula in week one.

Redshirt freshman **Gresch Jensen** has taken over the starting quarterback duties during the three Big Sky games and has thrown for 1,002 yards and seven touchdowns during that span. He took over for the injured Reese Phillips, who was a Kentucky transfer. The Griz still lead the Big Sky in scoring at 38.8 ppg and have upped that average to 41.7 ppg in league play.

Converted wide receiver **Makena Simis** played quarterback the last time UND and Montana met and the 6-foot-2 signal caller tied a school-record with six touchdown passes in his first collegiate start. He corralled his first touchdown reception of his career in the 39-31 victory last Saturday at Idaho State.

The Griz boast eight players with at least 10 receptions on the season with J. Louie-McGee leading the way with 24 receptions for 343 yards. **Keenan Curran** has provided the big-play threat, averaging a team-best 21.2 ypc on 17 grabs. His four scores are also a team-best total.

Running backs **Jeremy Calhoun** (440 yards, 5 TDs) and **Alijah Lee** (290 yards, 4 TDs) form a solid one-two punch in the Grizzlies' backfield.

Defensively, the Griz are yielding 37.3 ppg in Big Sky play and rank last in total defense, allowing 564.3 ypg, including 388.3 ypg through the air. Linebacker **James Banks** leads the Big Sky with 39 tackles in league play and his 66 total tackles are second most. Fellow linebacker **Josh Buss** is also among the top 10 in tacklers in the Big Sky with 55 total takedowns (eighth).

Senior defensive end **Tucker Schye** is top sack man in the Big Sky with 4.5 on the season and the Griz lead all teams with 20 total sacks on the campaign.

MARTIN INDUCTED INTO UND ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Former wide receiver **Tracy Martin** (1984-86) was among a quartet of individuals selected for the 2017 UND Letterwinners Athletics Hall of Fame Class, which was announced in May. Martin graduated as UND's career leader in regular-season touchdown receptions with 19, which is currently tied for fifth most in program history. He also graduated with the second-most regular-season receiving yards (1,754) and all-purpose yards (3,534) in UND history, which 30 years later are still among the top 10 totals in those categories. Martin was the first player in UND history to catch three TD passes in a single game and was a first-team All-NCC selection as a senior.

LARGE WIN

UND's 33-point spread over Sacramento State (Oct. 8) was the program's largest margin of victory in a conference game at the Division I level (since 2008), trumping a 45-14 win over Northern Colorado in 2015.

GROUND ATTACK

UND compiled 2,501 yards on the ground in 2016, cracking the 2,000-yard rushing mark for just the 16th time in school history. The total finished as the fifth-highest in program history. The 1975 team holds the single-season record with 3,100 rushing yards, which was set in just 10 games.

MISSOULA, Mont. -- Redshirt sophomore Makena Simis threw six touchdown passes in his first career start to lead No. 18/19 Montana to a 42-16 victory over North Dakota in Big Sky play Saturday at Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

UND (4-4, 2-3 BSC) got a spark early when freshman John Santiago opened the visitor's first offensive possession with a career-long 80-yard touchdown run, but the Grizzlies (5-3, 3-1 BSC) would settle in after that and only allow nine more points to the visitors.

Santiago finished with a career-high 178 rushing yards and was one yard shy of registering his second 300-yard all-purpose total of the season as he added 36 yards receiving and 85 kickoff return yards, but it was Simis who stole the show after starting the season as Montana's third-string quarterback.

"It's always good to get off to a good start in a tough place to play," UND head coach Bubba Schweigert said. "But, I knew it was a long game yet and they were going to make some plays. We respected their quarterback coming into the game and he did a nice job for them. We just have to do a better job across the board."

Simis threw a trio of touchdown passes in each half and finished 15-for-22 for 321 yards, tying Montana's single-game record with six scoring tosses.

After Santiago's big play, Simis evened things up at 7-7 on a 23-yard pass to Ben Roberts late in the first quarter. UND's defense held the Grizzlies on a fourth-and-1 to give the offense the ball at its own 40 midway through the second quarter and Ryan Bartels, who was making his second start in place of Keaton Studsrud, marched the visitors down the field.

Unfortunately, UND would have to settle for a 20-yard field goal after Bartels' third-down pass was batted away in the end zone. Sophomore Reid Taubenheim's 10th make of the season gave UND the lead at 10-7, but that would be the final lead of the game for UND.

Simis would give his team its first advantage thanks to a pair of long scoring strikes to Ellis Henderson on back-to-back possessions. Henderson went up high to snag a 36-yard throw for his first score, then broke through a tackle after another long grab to go in from 63 yards out. He had three catches for 114 yards in the opening half as Montana took a 21-10 lead into the break.

In the second half, it was Griz receiver Jamaal Jones that found paydirt twice on scoring plays of 74 and 22 yards as Montana grew its lead to as large as 42-10.

Bartels would engineer a late scoring drive for UND, capping an 11-play, 85-yard drive with a 7-yard pass to Luke Stanley, but the visitors were too far behind to muster any thoughts of a comeback.

Bartels finished 10-for-21 for 113 yards, while Santiago, Stanley and Brandon Walker each had two catches to lead the UND

Sophomore Connon O'Brien rounded out a trio of UND defenders with double digit tackles, totaling a career-high 10 in the loss ... Freshman John Santiago set the UND regular-season record for rushing yards by a freshman in the game, surpassing Phillip Moore's total of 846 set in 1995 ... Through eight games, Santiago now has 932 yards after racking up a career-high 178 rushing yards ... Santiago has a Big Sky-best six 100-yard rushing games on the season and has five straight in league action ... UND has now rushed for 240 or more yards in all five Big Sky games - 267 today ... Sophomore Jake Disterhaupt had his team-high third sack of the season in the first quarter ... Safety Cole Reyes returned after missing the last two games to finish with nine tackles ... Redshirt freshman DaQuan Baker made his UND debut and finished with three tackles.

Bubba Schweigert has developed a nice pattern through his first three seasons as the head football coach at North Dakota. Each year his squad produced two more victories than the previous one and 2016 was no exception as he was named the Big Sky and FCS Region 5 Coach of the Year.

The Fighting Hawks shared the Big Sky Conference regular season title with Eastern Washington, reeled off a 9-game winning streak and earned the No. 7 overall seed in the Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs in 2016.

After losing the first two games of the season by a combined four points, a double-overtime victory against South Dakota launched UND into Big Sky play where the Fighting Hawks ran the table. There were tight games and lopsided games, but his team always found a way to come out on top in league play and give UND its first undefeated conference record since Dale Lennon's 2003 squad went 7-0 in North Central Conference play.

The defense was once again the top-rated run unit in the league and sixth-best in the FCS. The unit was also tops in the Big Sky with 20 interceptions and tied for second nationally, trailing only national champion James Madison in that category.

Four Fighting Hawks earned All-America accolades, including safety Cole Reyes, who landed on six different All-America squads. The junior captain was also named the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year. Reyes was one of 15 UND players to earn All-Big Sky honors on the field, while 18 set a program record by being named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team. Senior Brian Labat led those efforts in the classroom and also earned CoSIDA All-District 6 Team honors.

Schweigert wrapped up the 2015 season with what was the first three-game winning streak of his UND head-coaching tenure. Those three victories gave his second UND squad a 7-4 overall record and 5-3 mark in Big Sky play, which were both two-game improvements from his first season back in Grand Forks.

Schweigert's defense led the Big Sky in rushing defense for the second straight season under his watch and the offense improved immensely thanks in large part to the record-breaking production of true freshman running back John Santiago.

After a 4-3 start that included the program's first victory over an FBS opponent (24-13 win at Wyoming) and first DI road victory over a ranked opponent (19-17 win; No. 16 Portland State), the Fighting Hawks would go on to post the program's first seven-win season since 2011.

Santiago was named the Co-Big Sky Freshman of the Year and collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and STATS, Inc. He was also a unanimous All-Big Sky first team performer and was joined on that team by senior linebacker Will Ratelle and offensive lineman Sean Meehan, who was also named to the AFCA All-America Team.

Eight more Fighting Hawks would garner all-league honors in 2015 as the defense once again ranked among the tops in the Big Sky, ranking first in rush defense and second in total defense. In the classroom, 17 UND football players were named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team, breaking the previous year's record by one.

In his first season back at UND, Schweigert's 2014 squad won five games overall, which was a two-game improvement from the previous season. The campaign was highlighted by a 30-28 upset of No. 22 Northern Arizona in the final home game of the season at the Alerus Center. UND took the positive vibes from a victory that knocked NAU out of the

2017 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

FSC playoff hunt to Greely, Colo., the next Saturday where the team closed out the season with its first Big Sky road win of the season -- a 33-14 defeat of Northern Colorado.

The defensive-minded head coach still works with the team's cornerbacks and they were part of a unit that led the Big Sky in total defense and rush defense in 2014. Two newcomers earned All-Big Sky Conference honors (KR Alex Tillman and PK Reid Taubenheim) and seven more players were named honorable mention in Schweigert's first season.

There were also 16 UND football players named to the All-Big Sky Academic team, which tied a program record for individuals honored in one season.

The Zeeland, N.D., native returned to Grand Forks after 10 years away from a program that he helped lead to the 2001 NCAA Division II national title as defensive coordinator.

Prior to his return to UND, Schweigert was the defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois for the previous six seasons (2008-13) and served as associate head coach for the last five of that stretch. His 2010 defense led the Missouri Valley in total defense and his unit finished in the top half of the league in four of his six campaigns at SIU.

In his six seasons at SIU, Schweigert coached three first team All-Americans and 20 all-conference selections (10 first team, six second team, four honorable mentions). His defensive standouts have included linebacker and 2012 graduate Jayson DiManche, currently playing for Cincinnati Bengals, and cornerback Korey Lindsey, a three-time All-American and a 2011 draft pick of the Bengals. In 2013, SIU linebacker Bryan Presume earned first team All-MVFC honors after ranking third in the league with 104 tackles. His 55 solo stops were tops in the conference.

Prior to arriving at SIU, Schweigert took on his first head coaching job at the collegiate level, leading the Division II program at Minnesota Duluth from 2004-07. He guided the Bulldogs to a 22-21 overall record during his tenure, including the program's first North Central Conference title in 2005. The NCAA playoff berth that season was the program's second in four seasons. That same season, Schweigert was also named the D2football.com Northwest Region Coach of the Year and the AFCA Division II Coach of the Year for Region 5.

This will be the second stint at UND for Schweigert. He spent 15 seasons as an assistant coach in Grand Forks (1989-2003) where he was part of eight NCAA playoff teams and six NCC title squads.

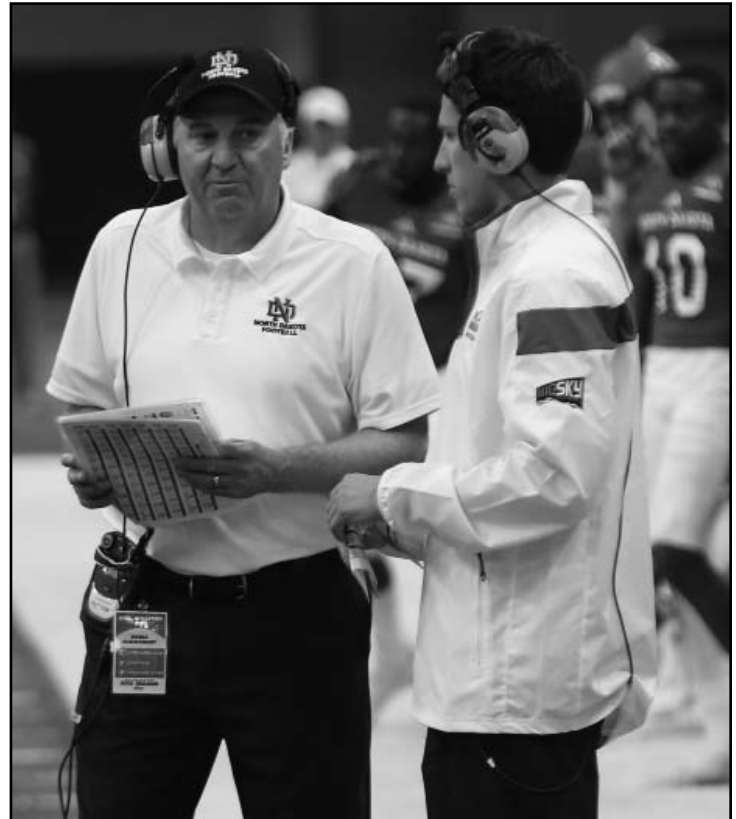
Schweigert was elevated to defensive coordinator at UND prior to the 1997 season and left for Duluth after the 2003 UND team finished as national runner-up. Schweigert was named the American Football Coaches Association Division II Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In his seven seasons as UND's defensive coordinator, Schweigert's defensive players earned 14 All-America honors and 23 first-team All-NCC accolades. His 2001 defense yielded just 191.4 yards of offense and 50.3 rushing yards per game, while limiting opponents to 12.5 points per game on the way to the program's first national championship.

Schweigert began his coaching career at his alma mater, now the University of Jamestown, from 1985-

1988. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Jamestown and a master's degree from UND. In 2002, he was honored with Jamestown's Rollie Greeno Award for outstanding commitment in the field of education and coaching.

Schweigert and his wife, Laura, have two sons, Alex and Cooper.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah -- 25th-ranked Utah outlasted Eighth-ranked North Dakota 37-16 in a matchup of ranked opponents from their respective levels of college football. The Football Bowl Subdivision's Utes won their 10th-straight season opener by outgaining the Football Championship Subdivision's Fighting Hawks 499-238 in total offense and by outrushing the visitors 272-51.

"One thing that I asked our team to do was play hard for 60 minutes and I think our guys did that tonight," UND head coach Bubba Schweigert said. "Could we play better? Sure. I think we can execute better.

"Defensively, (Darren) Carrington hurt us. We always want to tackle better and we take a lot of pride in tackling. We probably didn't do that as well as we needed to. Offensively, we want to run the ball with more consistency, but we knew that would be a challenge coming into the game."

The Utes' defensive front bottled up the All-Big Sky running back duo of John Santiago and Brady Oliveira, holding them to a combined 35 yards on 17 attempts. Quarterback Keaton Studsrud went 13-for-28 through the air for 175 yards and a touchdown, but the offense could never gain any traction in front of the 45th-straight sellout at Rice-Eccles Stadium. Studsrud went 3-for-3 for 76 yards on UND's lone touchdown drive that cut a fourth-quarter deficit to 27-16, but the Utes would get the final 10 points to end any thoughts of an upset.

Sophomore Travis Toivonen led UND with four receptions for 64 yards, while senior De'mun Mercer added three grabs for 32 yards. The Fighting Hawks were within a score at halftime thanks to the leg of placekicker Reid Taubenheim, who made all three of his field goal attempts in the opening 30 minutes. His 43-yard connection with two seconds remaining in the half made it a 17-9 contest.

Utah quarterback Tyler Huntley had an impressive collegiate debut after throwing an interception on his opening drive. UND's Evan Holm corralled that pick with a diving grab that set up Taubenheim's first field goal of the day from 32 yards out. Huntley settled down after that and went 23-for-32 through the air for 227 yards and added 70 rushing yards, while accounting for three of the Utes' four touchdowns.

The sophomore had two of those on the ground and the first was a 16-yard scamper with his team facing a 4th-and-1 early in the second quarter that put the Utes on the board. His throwing strike went to Carrington, who had 10 catches for 127 yards in his Utah debut after transferring from Pac-12 rival Oregon.

UND senior Jake Disterhaupt, who was making his first career start at inside linebacker, finished with a career-high 14 tackles to lead all players. He was one of four Fighting Hawks to register a new career-high in tackles.

GRAND FORKS, N.D. -- In Bubba Schweigert's third game as head coach at North Dakota back in 2014, UND was on the receiving end of a 38-0 Missouri State victory. Schweigert and the Fighting Hawks exacted a decisive measure of revenge on Saturday afternoon, pounding the Bears 34-0 in the 52nd annual Potato Bowl USA game.

Eleventh-ranked UND (1-1) broke things open with a 21-point outburst in the second quarter when sophomore wide receiver Noah Wanzek hauled in a pair of touchdown catches and John Santiago added a rushing score. That turned a 3-0 game into a 24-point lead for the home team, sending the Fighting Hawks to their fourth straight Potato Bowl win and their first Potato Bowl shutout since 2004.

The shutout was also the first of the Schweigert era and first overall for the program since the 2012 season opener, a 66-0 blanking of South Dakota Mines.

"I won't say we expected a shutout, but that's the goal every time we go out there," Schweigert said. "It was a good team win. We still have some things to clean up, but anytime you can run the ball the way we did and stop the run like we did, you're going to give yourself a chance for a positive result and that's we got today."

UND had chances early to break the game up open, but two trips inside the Bears' red zone in the opening quarter only yielded a 25-yard field goal by Senior Reid Taubenheim. The second quarter was a different story, however, as the home team scored touchdowns on its first three possessions to make it a 24-0 contest by halftime.

The Fighting Hawks racked up 526 yards of total offense, keyed by Wanzek's career-high 117 yards on seven catches. Keaton Studsrud was his typical efficient self, completing 22 of 31 passes for 273 yards and those two scoring strikes to Wanzek.

Junior Brady Oliveira paced the ground game with 16 carries for 164 yards, while Santiago and sophomore James Johannesson both added rushing scores in the victory. Johannesson's 19-yard rumble where he dragged several Bear defenders into the end zone with him, capped the scoring for the Fighting Hawks.

Defensively, UND blanked a Missouri State team that totaled 43 points last week at FBS-foe Missouri. The unit also forced three turnovers, including a key stop in the third quarter where the Bears had penetrated all the way down to the UND eight-yard line. Jason Randall picked up seven yards and was closing in on the goalline when he was stripped by Charles Flowers and the loose ball was recovered by linebacker Tanner Palmborg.

Flowers and classmate Cole Reyes shared the team-lead with seven tackles as the defense yielded only 211 total yards. UND dominated the time of possession (36:11 to 23:49) and ran 28 more offensive plays than the Bears in the contest (76 to 48).

VERMILLION, S.D. -- No. 23 South Dakota delivered a decisive 45-7 victory over No. 10 North Dakota in a matchup of border rivals at the DakotaDome on Saturday. In the only matchup of FCS-ranked foes this weekend, the Coyotes (3-0) dominated from the onset as the Fighting Hawks (1-2) could never find a rhythm on either side of the ball.

"This is one of those games you really have to learn from," UND head coach Bubba Schweigert said. "We can't just flush this one away. Early on, it was penalties that cost us. We had third-and-two and third-and-three that turned into third-and-long situations. You just can't do that.

"Then we couldn't stop their run game. We had chances to get them off the field and could not come up with a stop. That was the most disappointing part of it."

South Dakota quarterback Chris Streveler showed early in the contest why he had won back-to-back Missouri Conference Offensive Player of the Week accolades to start the season. Behind their senior leader, the Coyotes built a 17-0 lead in the first quarter and added two more touchdowns in the second quarter to jump out a 31-0 lead at halftime.

Streveler had 49 rushing yards and a touchdown and went 17-for-23 through the air for 241 yards and a score before the break and finished with 352 yards of total offense and accounted for three of the Coyotes' five touchdowns. True freshman Kai Henry matched Streveler's two rushing scores and rushed for a team-high 80 yards on 12 carries.

UND managed just 103 yards of total offense in the first half and its best scoring chance came after a 66-yard kickoff return by John Santiago, but came up empty after a 41-yard field goal attempt by Reid Taubenheim sailed wide.

The Coyotes' were stout defensively too as UND went just 1-for-12 on third-down conversions and came up empty on four fourth-down attempts.

The Fighting Hawks cracked the scoreboard midway through the third-quarter when Keaton Studsrud found Travis Toivonen from 10 yards out, but it was too late to mount the thrilling comeback UND put together a season ago in the 47-44 double-overtime win against the Coyotes in Grand Forks.

Santiago finished with 85 yards rushing to pace UND, who finished with just 102 total yards on the ground. Studsrud finished 11-for-22 in the passing department for 133 yards and the scoring strike to Toivonen.

Neither team turned the ball over in a contest that saw USD outgain UND by over 300 yards (575 to 257). The Coyotes were also 8-for-17 on third down and converted both of their fourth-down attempts. USD also held a 33-10 advantage in first downs.

GRAND FORKS, N.D. -- Montana State quarterback Chris Murray accounted for four touchdowns and the Bobcats piled up twice as many total yards as North Dakota to knock off the 17th-ranked Fighting Hawks 49-21 in the Big Sky opener for both teams Saturday at the Alerus Center.

After going three-and-out on their opening possession, the Bobcats (1-2, 1-0 BSC) scored touchdowns on seven of their next eight times with the ball to snap UND's 11-game league winning streak that dated back to the 2015 season. MSU's victory over the Fighting Hawks (1-3, 0-1 BSC) also came in front of the first sellout crowd at the Alerus Center since the 2009 season opener.

MSU finished with a 515 to 255 edge in total offense with 341 of those coming on the ground. The visitors also went 12-for-16 on third-down conversions, including a stretch where they converted 10 in a row to help own a 19:22 time of possession advantage (39:41 to 20:19).

The Bobcats blocked a 45-yard field goal attempt by Reid Taubenheim in the opening quarter and would turn that momentum into the first of four opening-half touchdowns.

The first two came on the ground, compliments of Logan Jones (11 yards) and Troy Andersen (2 yards). Murray tossed the final two scores of the half, finding Wilston Brott on a 12-yard strike and Jabarri Johnson on a 13-yarder with 57 ticks to play.

UND's offense went three-and-out following the first three MSU touchdowns and the Fighting Hawks' defense came up with the only touchdown of the half when Jake Disterhaupt picked off Murray and raced 37 yards to make it 21-7.

That would be the only drive for MSU that did not result in a touchdown until late in the fourth quarter when the Bobcat reserves were held to back-to-back punts.

Murray responded to his lone mistake of the day and marched his team on 9-play, 72-yard drive that he capped with a perfectly thrown fade route to Johnson to make it a 28-7 lead.

UND managed to erase three points from its deficit on the final drive of the half when Taubenheim made a 37-yard field to pull within 28-10 at halftime.

More than half of UND's 102 yards of total offense came on that final scoring drive, while the Bobcats racked up 289 first-half yards, including 182 on the ground.

The Fighting Hawks got a 44-yard field goal from Taubenheim on their opening drive of the third quarter, but Murray capped a nine-play, 81-yard drive with a 44-yard pass to Kevin Kassis.

Murray finished the game 15-for-19 for 174 passing yards and three scores, while adding a game-high 132 yards rushing and

A Brady Oliveira 34-yard run and two-point conversion pass to Noah Wanzek cut UND's deficit to 35-21 at the 3:22 mark of the third quarter, but the Bobcats would once again have an answer.

Andersen would bury any hopes of a UND comeback with a 27-yard touchdown run that put an end to a 14-play, 83-yard drive that chewed up nearly half a quarter (7:27). Andersen joined Murray over the century-mark in rushing with 131 yards.

The Bobcats held UND's ground game in check, limiting the home team to just 102 rushing yards. Oliveira had 39 of those, while quarterback Keaton Studsrud added 34. The senior captain also went 15-for-27 through the air for 147 yards, but the UND offense managed just 12 first down and converted only 5-of-14 third-down chances.

Disterhaupt finished with a game-high 12 tackles to go with his pick six, while junior Tamas Stewart added a career-high 10 tackles after replacing All-American Cole Reyes, who left the game with an injury in the second quarter.

DAVIS, Calif. -- UC Davis got a stellar performance from quarterback Jake Maier as the Aggies dealt visiting North Dakota a 48-24 setback in Big Sky play Saturday at Aggie Stadium. Maier got going early by throwing for a trio of first-half touchdown passes, helping the Aggies (3-2, 1-1 BSC) build a 38-17 lead on UND (1-4, 0-2 BSC) by halftime.

The JUCO transfer finished the game 33-for-38 for 415 yards and four touchdowns as UND fell for the third consecutive game.

Junior John Santiago took UND's second play from scrimmage 81 yards for a touchdown to jump-start the Fighting Hawks. He finished with 170 rushing yards to register the first 100-yard rushing game of his season and 14th of his career. Classmate Brady Oliveira added 107 rushing yards as UND racked up a season-high 294 yards on the ground.

Maier and the Aggies overmatched those efforts, however, out-gaining the Fighting Hawks 651-451 in total offense.

"I thought we got here and were in a good frame of mind, but we gave up too many points and too many big plays early," UND head coach Bubba Schweigert said. "They put us on our heels tonight. We really need to rally and motivate the guys to stick with it. This is a program where the vision doesn't change. The belief in how we do things doesn't change, but we have to get better results."

Wide receiver Keelan Doss was Maier's favorite target, hauling in 11 passes for a career-high 199 yards. He caught a 65-yard touchdown pass on the first play for the Aggies after Santiago's big run and the home team led 14-7 before three minutes had passed.

UC Davis would never trail again as Maier found Wesley Preece for the next score on a 3-yard strike. It would be the first of three touchdown receptions for the Aggies' tight end, who finished with eight catches for 97 yards. The home team would convert a UND turnover into another touchdown and Preece's second score came after a three-and-out to push the advantage to 35-10 before the Fighting Hawks could regroup.

UND quarterback Keaton Studsrud trimmed the deficit to 35-17 with a 12-yard run late in the second quarter, but the Aggies tacked on three more points before the half thanks to a 21-yard field goal from Max O'Rourke.

UND opened the second half with the ball, but that drive stalled on a missed fourth-down conversion attempt and UC Davis would manage the only points of the third quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Max O'Rourke.

Both teams traded fourth-quarter touchdowns to bring the final spread to a 24-point margin. UND's score came on a 36-yard reception by Hunter Pinke, who scored the touchdown on his first career reception.

GRAND FORKS, N.D. -- North Dakota racked up a season-high 562 yards of total offense en route to a 48-38 Homecoming win over Northern Colorado Saturday afternoon at the Alerus Center in Big Sky Conference play.

The Fighting Hawks (2-4, 1-2 Big Sky) took an early 28-7 lead, but Northern Colorado came storming back to take a third quarter lead. UND kept a five-game winning streak over the Bears in tact, however, by pounding away on the ground to forge its only rally.

The offense totalled a season-high rushing 314 yards, which included a game-high 109 from Brady Oliveira and 97 more from senior quarterback Keaton Studsrud to snap a three-game skid. UND outscored the Bears 10-0 in the fourth quarter and dominated time of possession, holding a 15-plus minute advantage in that category.

The quarterbacks took the spotlight in the opening quarter. Studsrud got the Fighting Hawks on the board first with a fourth-down sneak that wound up going 41 yards for a touchdown.

Northern Colorado's Jacob Knipp would answer, however, completing an 80-yard strike as he was being hit to tie the score.

On the ensuing possession, Studsrud and the UND offense converted a pair of fourth downs, including a five-yard scoring reverse by Travis Toivonen. Studsrud helped spring Toivonen's first career rushing touchdown with a downfield block to wrap up an impressive 12-play, 75-yard drive that spanned 7:41.

Early in the second quarter, the defense created a turnover deep in UNC territory and this time North Dakota needed just one play to convert it into points.

After redshirt freshman Cam Hunt came down with an interception on just his third collegiate snap, Studsrud found Alex Cloyd for a 21-yard score that left the Fighting Hawks up 21-7. The receiving touchdown was Cloyd's first of his career.

On UND's next drive, sophomore running back James Johannesson then punched one in from four yards out on his first carry of the game to put the home team ahead 28-7.

The momentum quickly shifted, however, and UNC scored 17 of what would be 24 unanswered points before halftime. The Bears got a long field goal (46 yards) then converted a pair of fumbles into touchdowns to sneak back within four at 28-24 by the break.

Root missed a chance to pull the Bears within a point at halftime as his 49-yard field goal sailed wide. The big blow to UNC happened on the play before that as he was injured and did not return following a 28-yard completion to Frank Stephens.

With back-up quarterback Conor Regan at the helm to start the second half, the Bears would use just 90 seconds to take their first lead of the game at 31-28 on a 10-yard run by Trae Riek.

UND would bring a halt to the 24-0 run by the visitors and square the game at 31-31 thanks to a 30-yard field goal by Reid Taubenheim on the next possession. After holding UNC to a punt, junior John Santiago gave the lead back to North Dakota with a 2-yard scoring plunge midway through the third quarter. Santiago finished with 15 carries for 70 yards.

Regan and the Bears answered quickly, tying the score at 38-38 head-
