ON TAP

North Dakota heads right from California to Hawaii for the seven-game Rainbow Wahine Classic, beginning Wednesday. UND will battle fourth-ranked Tennessee twice in the Classic with two games apiece against Cleveland State, host Hawaii and a single game with Maryland to wrap up the final game before conference season starts (Mar. 23 at Portland State).

PERFECT GAME GEM

Kaylin VanDomelen twirled her first career perfect game Mar. 9 vs. Santa Clara, striking out a career-best 14 in the win. She needed just 64 pitches (49 for strikes) in the victory, striking out the side on three different occasions.

NO-NO, NO-NO, NO-NO

Kaylin VanDomelen's perfect game gave her a third no-hitter in her career and second in a two-week span. She threw her second career no-hitter Feb. 24 against Cleveland State, going 7.0 innings with seven strikeouts. She also earned her 10th career shutout in the win. Her last no-no hitter came against UCONN in March of last season.

OOPS, I DID IT AGAIN

Kaylin VanDomelen was named the Big Sky Conference Pitcher of the Week for the second consecutive time on March 6th. She threw two complete-game four-hitters last week with nine strikeouts in each win. She bested Rutgers in eight innings without an earned run Saturday then beat host Hampton Sunday with just one earned run.

SEVEN-WIN STREAK

North Dakota rattled off seven straight wins from Feb. 24 to Mar. 3 this season, its longest win streak in the program's Division I history. It ranks as the second-longest winning streak ever at UND, following a 13-game streak back in 2000.

YOU TRIPLIN'

Angel Love has six triples already this season, second-most in all of NCAA Division I. She's done so with three different games with two three-baggers. Her season total is already third-best in the UND record books and it puts her eighth in the career category as well.

ANGEL'S IN THE OUTFIELD

Angel Love hit .500 in the first weekend (seven hits), followed that up with four hits, including two homers in week two and again had seven hits in week three (.500). She paces the team in triples (6), batting average (.421), hits (24), homers (3), RBI (15), total bases (48), slugging percentage (.842), on-base percentage (.450) and steals (10).

COMMON ZINS

Michaela Zins homered for the first time in her career in the 4-3 win over Cleveland State on Feb. 25. The senior has three extra-base hits to her credit of her eight career hits (2 doubles, 1 HR).

PERFECT ON THE BASEPATHS

Angel Love has stolen a Big Sky-leading 10 bases so far this season. She swiped three bags at Charleston Southern on Feb. 8, a career best. The Las Vegas, Nev., product has yet to be thrown out in her career (14-14).

I'M LOVE-IN' IT

Angel Love hit two homers at Arizona State, the firsts of her career. She also stole two bases and tallied four hits on the weekend.

YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS

Alicia Young whacked a double and a homer en route to a career-high five RBIs in the 9-5 win at Tennessee State on Feb. 26. She reached base three times and also stole a base in the win.

HONOR ROLL

Both VanDomelen and Love earned Big Sky Conference weekly honors for their performances in week three at the Belmont/Tennessee Winter Warmup. VanDomelen won two games, saved two more and threw her second career no-hitter while Love hit five extra-base hits, including four triples and scored seven times in the five games.

NADLER'S NOD

Senior Taylor Nadler was named the Big Sky Conference Player of the Week after driving in 10 runs in five games in the opening week of the season at Charleston Southern. The senior hit safely in all five games, extending her hitting streak to seven. She drove in runs in four of the games, including two RBI hits in the first inning alone of Sunday's win at South Carolina State.

TAY TEN

Senior Taylor Nadler racked up 10 RBI in the opening weekend, notching three in a game on two different occasions. She had at least one RBI in all but one game and extended her hitting streak to seven straight, dating back to last season.

HANNAH HOPPING UP THE LIST

Hannah Bergh has six wins this season already and has moved up on the career wins mark at UND. She now has 29, good for seventh.

MAYHOOD UP TO NO GOOD

Lexi Mayhood whacked her first career dinger Feb. 9 against Towson. She totaled three hits in the opening weekend to surpass her hit total from all of last season.

OFF TO OGDEN

The Big Sky Conference will host the conference tournament in Ogden, Utah on the campus of Weber State University. WSU also hosted last season's tournament in the old format of regular season champion hosting the six-team postseason tournament. This year, league officials went to a pre-determined site. UND is in the final season in the Big Sky Conference and will move to The Summit League next season.

Jordan Stevens begins his fourth year as the head coach of the University of North Dakota softball program. UND Athletics Director Brian Faison announced that the former Valparaiso head coach was named head coach at UND on July 7, 2014.

UND's success on the diamond has continued to grow under Stevens' tutelage, as his teams have recorded more wins with each successive season. Last year, UND ripped off a program record for home wins and Big Sky wins on the way to the school's first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament berth.

The team was led by Big Sky Pitcher of the Year Kaylin VanDomelen, who became a two-time member of the all-league first team. UND was just one win shy of the program record for victories.

The 2016 season also marked a milestone for UND softball, as the team picked up its first-ever All-Big Sky First Team honoree, in pitcher Kaylin VanDomelen. Additionally, in 2016 UND earned its first ever wins against opponents from the Big 12 (Iowa State, Feb. 14) and the ACC (Virginia, Feb. 20).

In his first season, North Dakota recorded twice as many wins from the previous season. The 2015 squad also set a program record, hitting 73 doubles on the year. The team also hit 47 home runs, which ranked second all-time in program history.

Stevens spent the previous four seasons as head coach at Valparaiso, where he guided the Crusaders to consecutive NCAA tournament appearances in 2012 and 2013. In his four years at the helm, Stevens posted a 131-96-1 record, as his teams never finished lower than third in either the regular season or conference tournament.

During his tenure at Valparaiso, Stevens coached 25 student-athletes to all-league honors, including eight first-team accolades and four all-region honors. Additionally, he recruited the 2012 Horizon League Newcomer of the Year, the 2013 Championship Batter and Pitcher of the Horizon League Tournament, and the 2014 Horizon League Co-Player of the Year.

In his first season with Valpo, Stevens guided the Crusaders to 34 victories, including a 13-game winning streak. In Horizon League play his team went 15-7, finishing just one-half game shy of the regular-season championship. The Crusaders' 2011 success was in large part due to their record-setting offensive output. Valpo paced the league in nine separate offensive categories, setting team single-season records for runs batted in (245) and home runs (49). Individually, Stevens coached seven league leaders, while two Crusaders broke Valpo's single-season RBIs record and three topped the previous single-season home runs mark. Seven players in all earned all-league recognition, as well as one all-region honoree.

The 2012 Crusaders re-wrote the program's record books, setting 14 new team single-season records and 14 new individual records. Stevens led Valpo to 42 victories that season, setting a program single-season record, and claimed the school's first women's Horizon League championship after going 19-5 in league play. The squad had five players earn postseason honors from the Horizon League, including the league's Newcomer of the Year and four first team all-league honorees. Three players also earned NFCA all-region honors as well.

Stevens then led the Crusaders on a dramatic run to the 2012 Horizon League Tournament Championship. After falling in the first game of the tournament, Valpo won five consecutive knockout games, the last three of which came in walk-off fashion, to claim the Horizon League Championship and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA Tournament, Stevens led Valpo to within one out of a massive upset at No. 9/7 Louisville in the tournament opener before a walk-off homer, while the Crusaders also had the tying run on base in the seventh inning of their elimination game against Kentucky.

For the second consecutive year, the Crusaders went on a run to the Horizon League Championship, winning five-straight elimination games after losing their opener to claim the tournament crown. Having earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament for a second-straight season, Stevens led the Crusaders one step farther in 2013, as Valpo downed Central Michigan for its first NCAA tournament win in program history. Valpo won 29 games in the regular season, including a third-place finish within Horizon League play.

Prior to his time at Valparaiso, Stevens was the head coach at Union College, leading the Dutchwomen to their most successful season in program history. He led Union to a school-record-tying 32 victories en route to the team's first Liberty League regular-season title in five years and the program's first-ever league tournament championship.

Before becoming a head coach, Stevens spent a season as assistant coach at the University of Rhode Island in 2009, where he was directly responsible for the development and coaching of the pitching staff. He also served two seasons as an assistant coach at Niagara University, where he was responsible for the development and individual instruction in hitting. From 2004 to 2006, Stevens was the head varsity softball coach at Notre Dame Academy in Toledo, Ohio.

Stevens graduated from Bowling Green State University in 2004 with his bachelor's degree in sport management.
